BULLYING - BRUTALISTS - AUTHORITARIANISM

- Brutal comes from the word brute, Middle French meaning animal.
- Brutalists are materialists, believing that money, privilege, status and power rule. Survival of the fittest and most powerful.
- They have a non-democratic view of power, political process and social relations.
- They value authoritarianism, not democracy.
- Fundamentally, they think power is a zero-sum game.
- Either you hold power, or you are held by it.
- You are the boot on someone's neck, or there will be a boot on yours. Alpha males dominate.
- They agree that what they have was taken from others.
- They think that's the way of all things.
- Either you take, or are taken from. Dog eat dog.
- Take out your frustrations on others. Kick the dog.
- The hurt, may hurt others. The abused, may abuse others.
- They are not interested in climate science, racial justice, democratic norms, sustainable economic policy, public goods, safety nets, or compassion.










- 1. POWER: The problems persists because the present power relations make change difficult. Who should be involved, and in what roles?
- 2. SOLUTIONS: Solutions may involve rethinking VALUES, BOUNDARIES, RELATIONSHIPS, SYTEMS, PERSPECTIVES, ASSUMPTIONS. Solutions may require a balance between INCLUSION (constraints on involvement of all possible stakeholders, time constraints to gather information and points of view) and PRACTICALITY (manageability of the process).
- **3. INTERLINKING:** There are many interlinked issues cutting across disciplines (economy, employment, policing, military), agencies (health, education, housing), sectors (public, private, volunteer), and scales (local, Multinational, national, multinational, global).
- 4. VIEWS: There may be different views on the problem and potential solutions.
- 5. CONFLICT: Conflict over desired outcomes and the means to achieve them create breakdowns and walking away from the extensive effort needed to find solutions.
- 6. UNCERTAINY: The uncertainty about the possible effects of the actions generate discomfort, and the wish to again ignore the issues.
