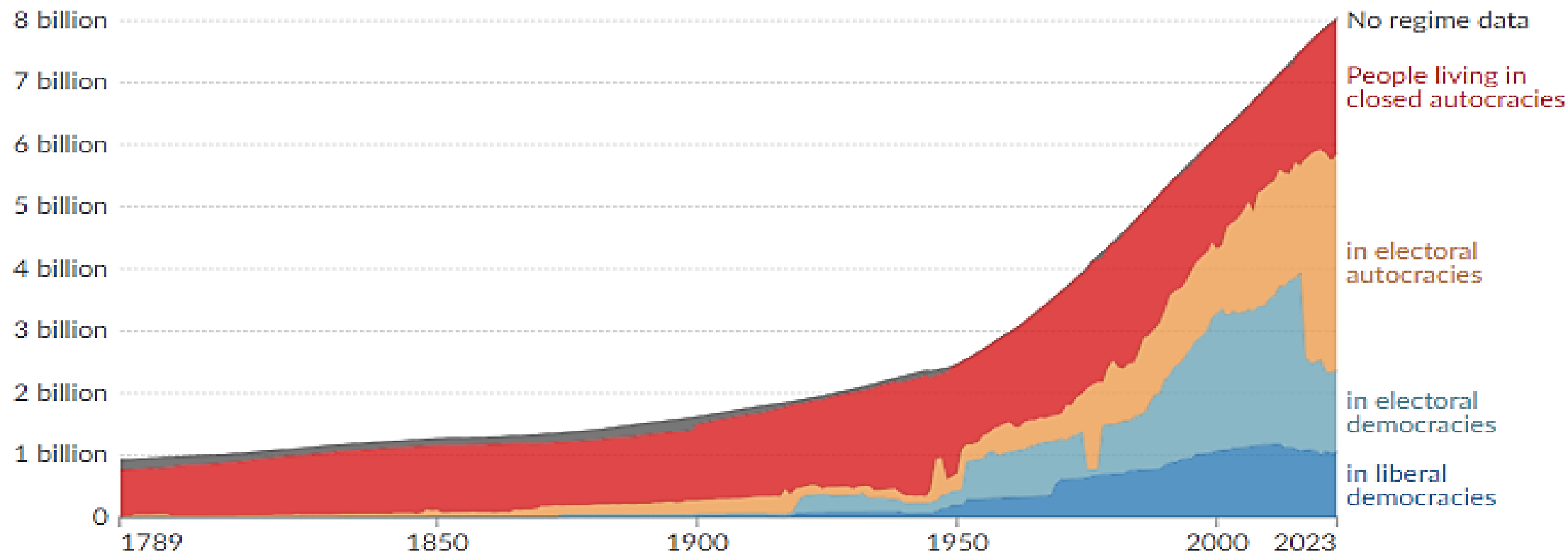

Devolution of Politics & Government

1. Aggressive gerrymandering creates deeply partisan districts where representation is decided in primary contests, not general elections.
2. Politics becomes a system of binary conflicts of the Culture Wars (Traditional values vs. Modern values) with each side of the Culture War highly organized, marketing and promoting their side on social media and in public meetings.
3. The Culture War has led to extreme polarization and real war in Russia (Traditional) and Ukraine (Modern).
4. The political parties, fiercely represent one side of the binary issues and are incentivized to remain in conflict.
5. The public votes for their single issue only, even if the leaders of their party are not productive.
6. Social media and cable news incentivizes politicians to perform for the camera.
7. Televised committee hearings make legislators into budding social media stars. Congressional committees are no longer venues for Congress to have dialogue with administrative agencies. They are there to get viral memes and then do fundraising.
8. Political parties can become captive to their loudest and most extreme members. Activists on the fringes of the parties are the people who turn out in primaries, so those are the people deciding those districts.
9. The media then also immensely profit from this conflict by generating audiences.
10. The Legislative branch is in such conflict that the Executive branch and the Judicial branch step in to fill the void.
11. The public's loss of faith in the government itself has created a vicious cycle, where some elected representatives appear determined to prove that the government doesn't work by actively undermining it.

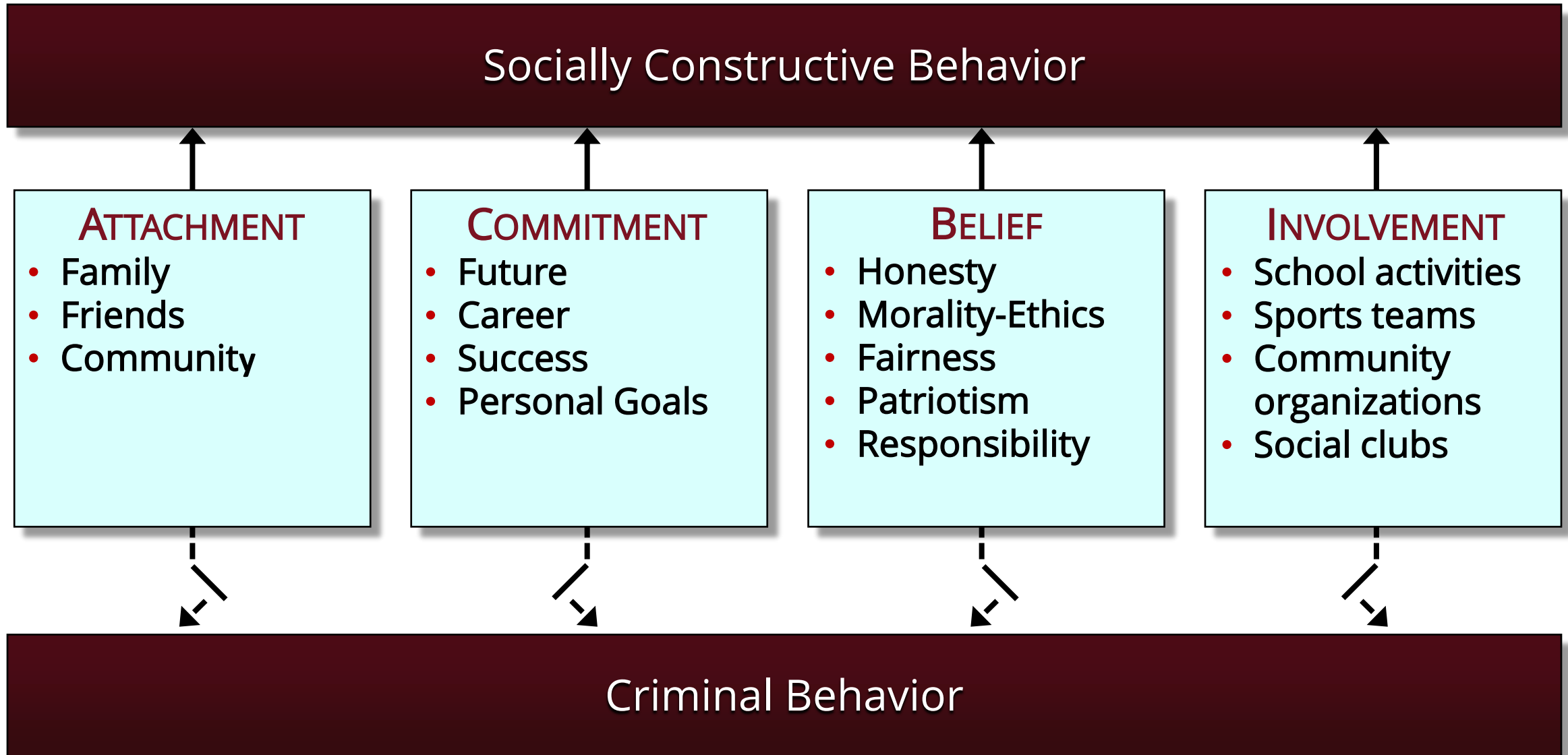

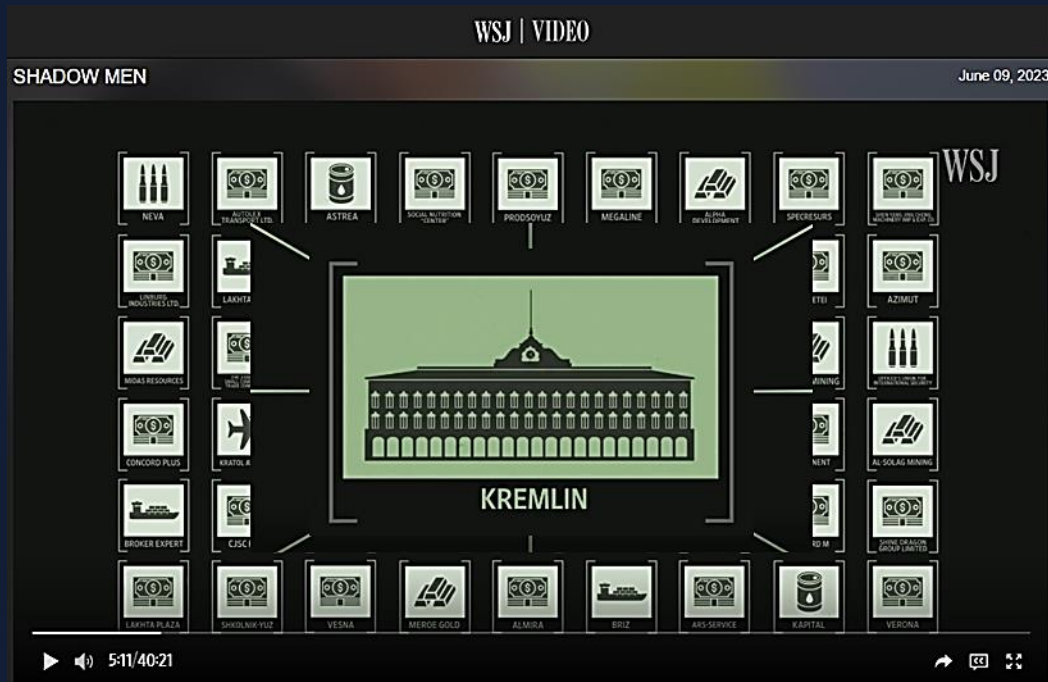

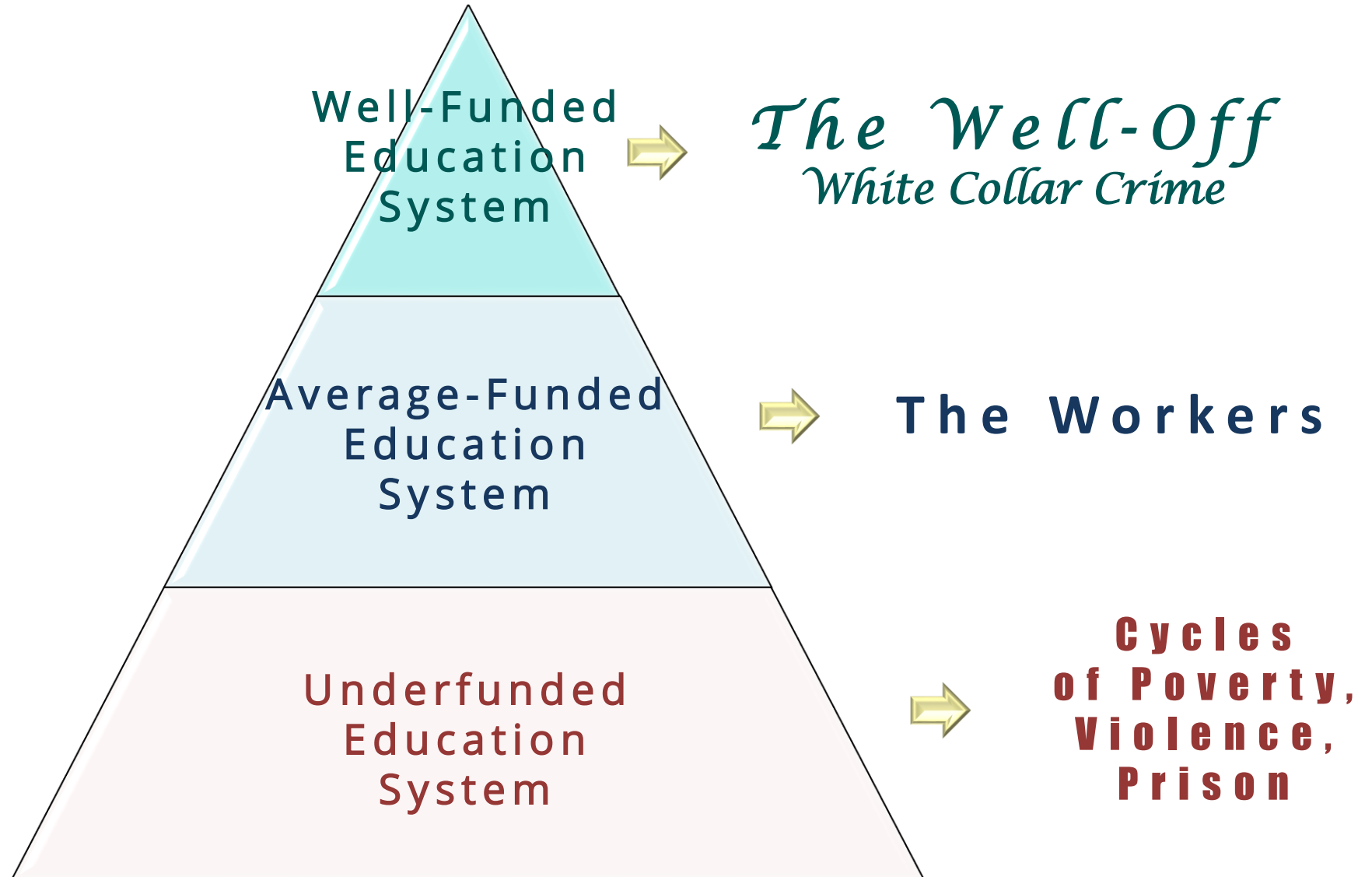
- Children need to be guided in their schoolwork or they can easily fall behind.

- Hurt people, hurt people - so bullies terrorize other children.

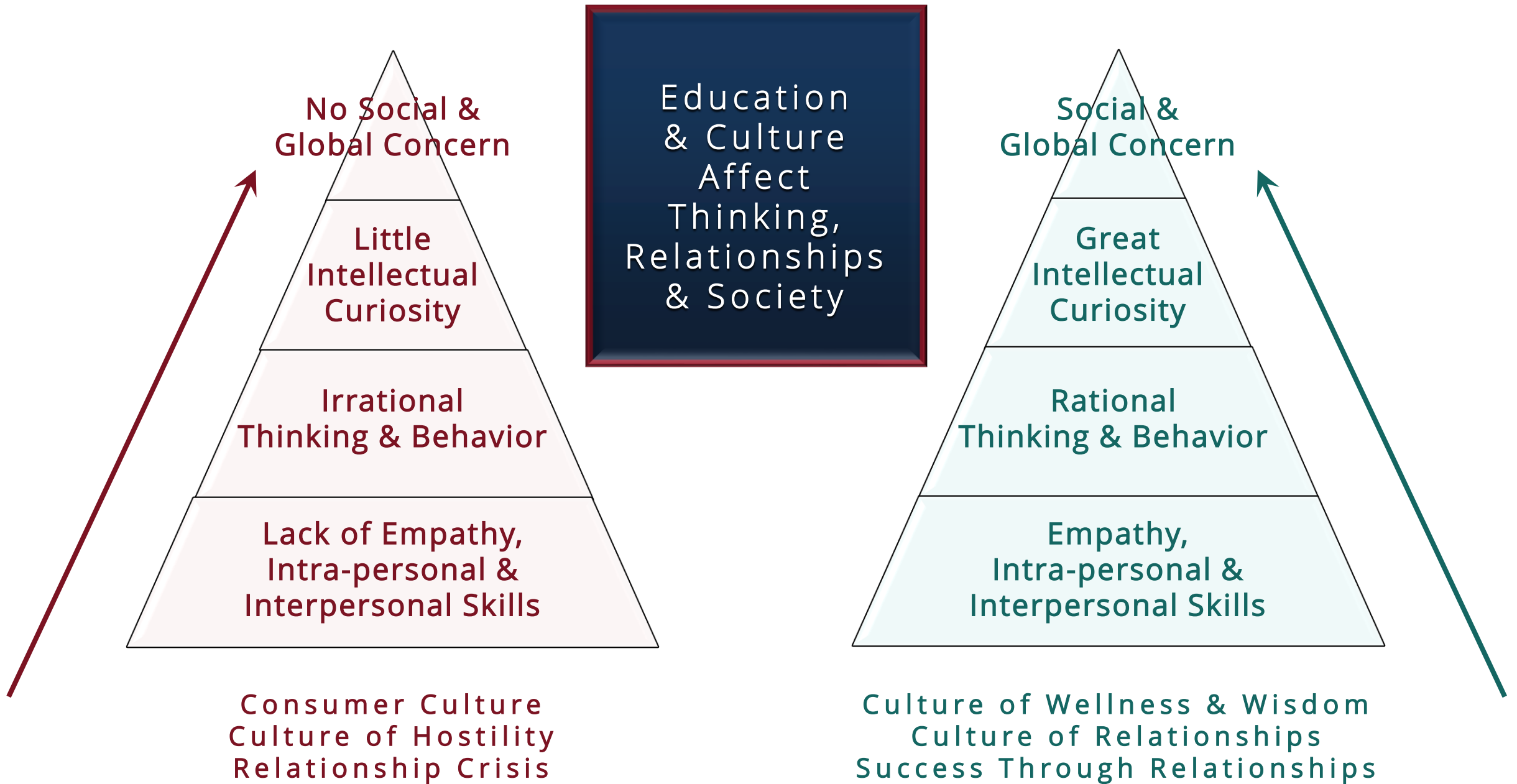
Three Education Systems

High wealth communities can also afford private extra tutoring.

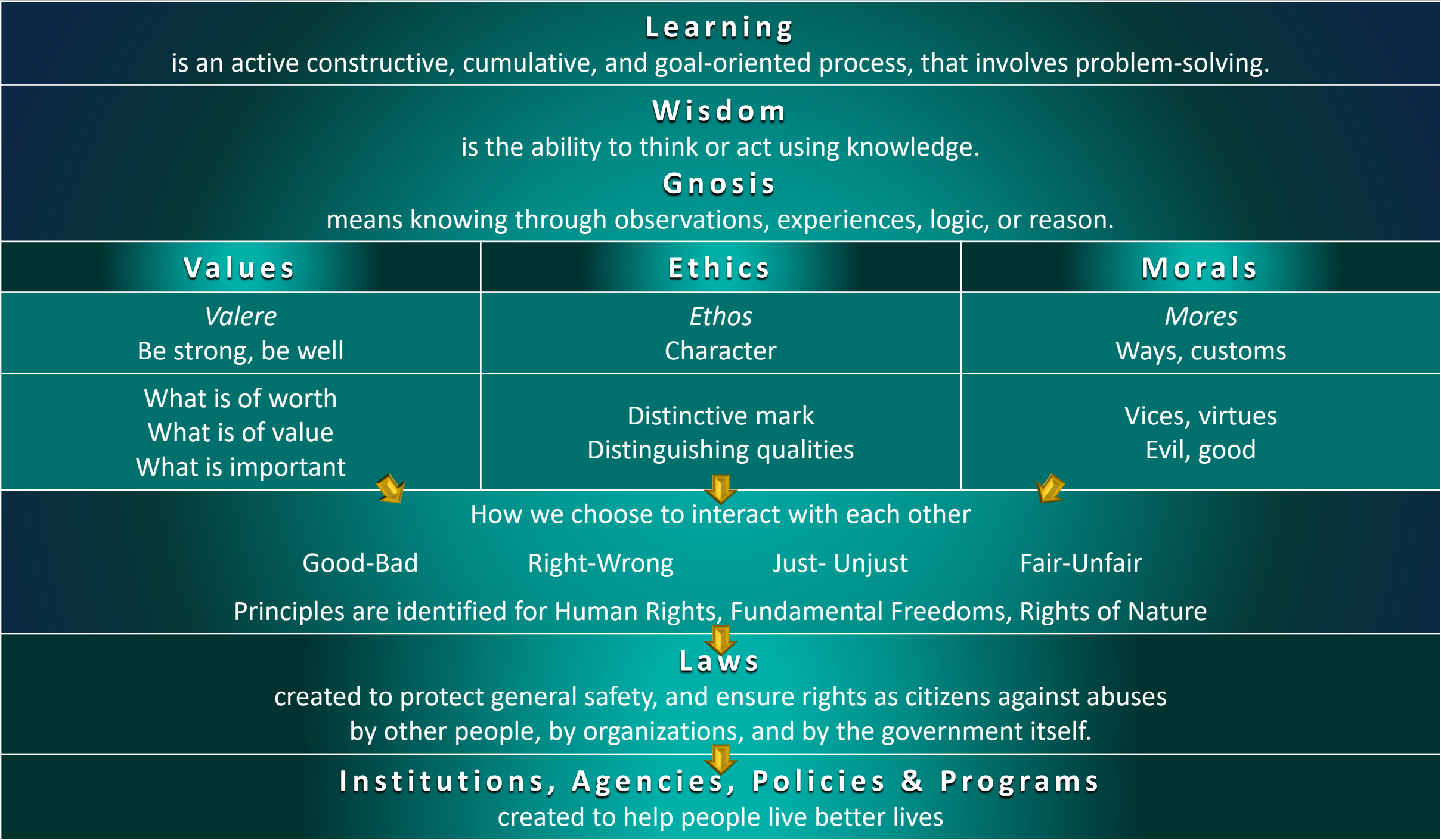

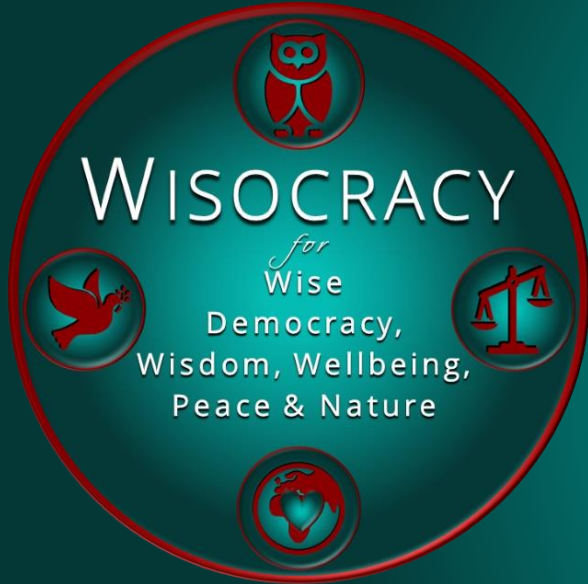

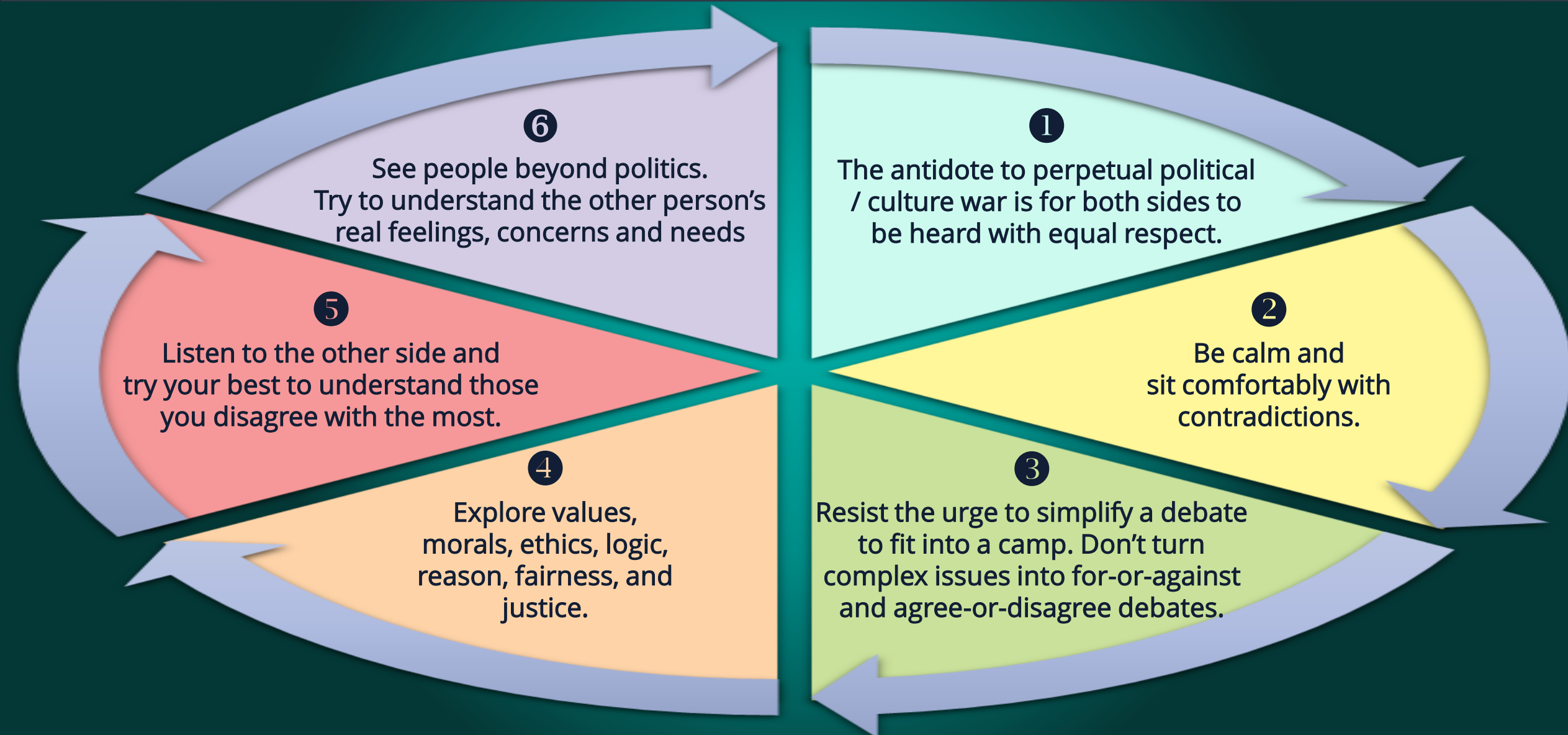

19. Notice when you're too stressed to continue the conversation.

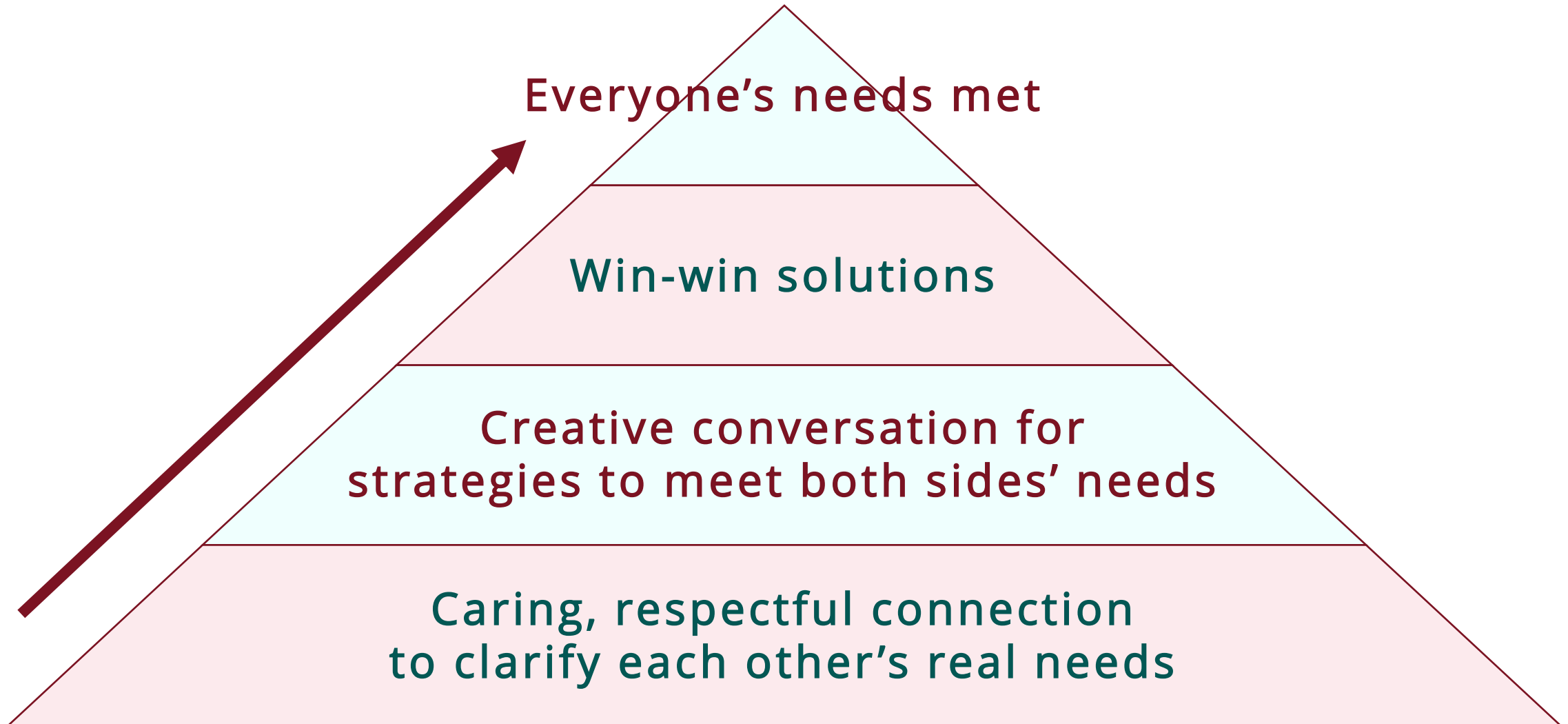

Public Interest Journalism



Journalism that serves the public interest provides information that is relevant to the lives and well-being of all of us, to society, and to our communities. It concerns the “common good” and is about what matters to everyone in society.

Public interest journalism could be considered the antithesis of the media’s destructive side, which includes fake news, propaganda, censorship, sensationalism, sexploitation, and voyeurism.

Journalism for the public interest plays a central role in having a safe, healthy, and fully functioning society.

It gives people the information they need to take part in the democratic process, and if journalists are good at their job, they hold governments and other institutions to account.

Public Interest Journalism



Public interest journalism is often about topics that are essential for our democracy but can be difficult or dry to understand.

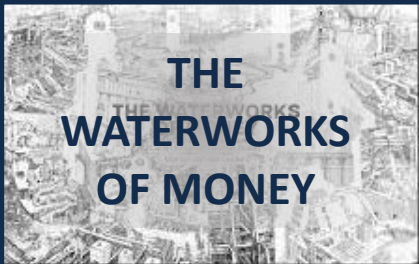
It is hard, complex, and time-consuming to do, but it often challenges the powerful and stands up for the powerless.

Despite the undeniable benefits for democracy, the economy, human rights, and society at large, people are not lining up to pay for this kind of journalism.

All serious journalism contains a public service ethic, and to fulfill this public service role, journalists must build and retain the trust of their audiences by behaving in an ethical and professional manner.

Is there contact information such as a publisher or e-mail address? Is the language too technical or simple for your needs? Can I find better information somewhere else?
A	AUTHORITY Is the source authoritative?	Is there an author? What are their credentials or experience? Are they qualified to write on the topic? Are they affiliated with an organization or university? Does the URL show anything about the author or source? .com, .edu, .gov
A	ACCURACY Is it accurate, reliable, truthful, correct?	Where does the information come from? Are the original sources cited? Can I verify this information? Is the information supported by evidence? Has the information been independently reviewed or referred? Can you verify any of the information in another source or from personal knowledge? Are there spelling, grammar, or typing errors?
P	PURPOSE What is its purpose, the reason the information exists?	Is advertising mixed in with the content? Does the point of view appear objective and impartial? Do the authors / sponsors make their intentions or purpose clear? What is the author's purpose for writing this, to inform, educate, entertain, persuade, or sell? Does the tone seem judgmental or overly positive? Is the information based on facts, feelings, values, opinions, or propaganda? Are possible political, cultural, religious, institutional, or personal bias clearly stated?

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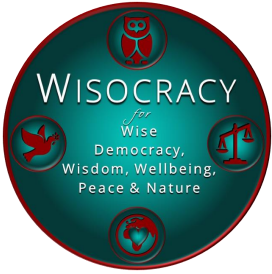
