The Major Patterns on Earth

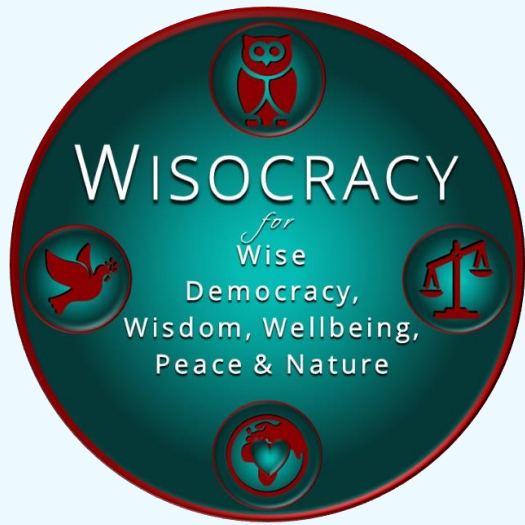

Political	Politics has become a win-lose, big money maker for lobbyists, media advertising, pundits, podcasters, merchandisers, and political parties. Wisocracy has 10 methods for evolving conscious politics and effective governments.
Economic	Dysfunctional economics is causing an ever-expanding wealth gap leading to violence, and the destruction of nature. Growth Economics has led to being 300% over Earth's carrying capacity. Wellbeing Economy is seeking to create better methods to balance the economy.
Military	Nuclear arsenals and killing machines can destroy humanity and all life on Earth. The global military-industrial complex has produced a process that has currently created 110 conflicts and wars around the world.
Environmental	Carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide are heating the air and oceans. There is deforestation and rapid deterioration of nature, causing climate catastrophes in rapid super storms, fires, floods, droughts, and melting ice that can engulf all coastal cities and islands.

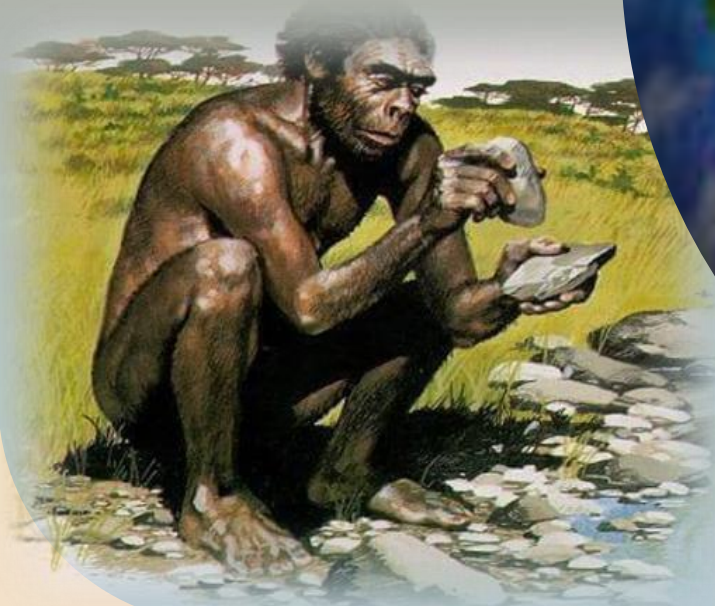

4 **CALMING AND UNDERSTANDING** the meaning of emotions and any unfulfilled needs.

5 **DEEPLY LISTENING** to understand more and what is really going on.

6 **SORTING COMPLEXITY** into categories of opinions, facts, feelings, values, needs.

7 **QUIETLY ACCESSING** inner wisdom by asking a question.
QUIETLY LETTING the brain access memory and creative problem-solving.
QUIETLY LISTENING for an inner wise answer.

8 **CREATING INSIGHTS** and connecting the dots.

Wise Leadership Traits

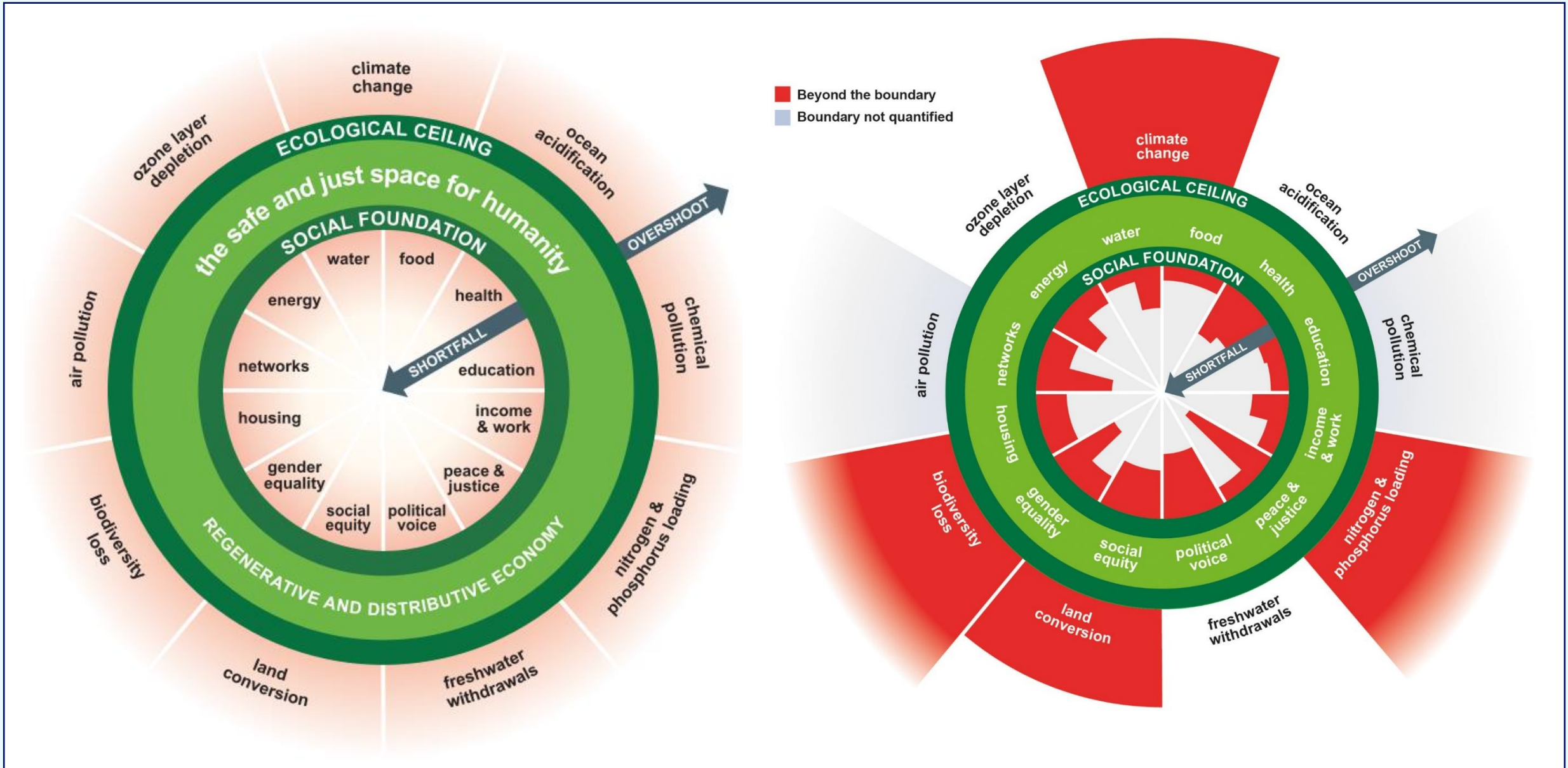


1	Perspective	Sees Earth in space and all connected in one living system.

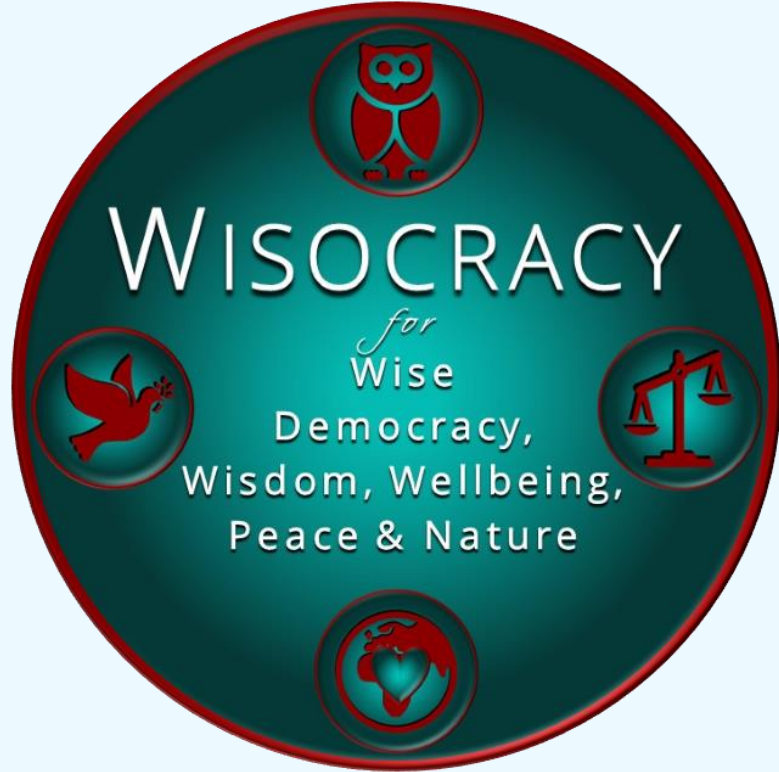

3	GOOD GOVERNANCE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Good governance processes: accountability, transparency, and efficacy (right goals).
4	CIVIC DELIBERATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Deliberative democracy through respectful civic participation in public assemblies.
5	BUILDING TRUST & COLLABORATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In a polarized world, Wisocracy focuses on building trust and collaboration in the family, the community, the country, and the world.
6	COMPASSIONATE COMMUNICATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Understanding the fears, concerns, and needs of each of the various groups of political voices that the other side ignores. Addressing the real needs of boys and men, and girls and women, driving the political and social conflict.
