Teddy Roosevelt Reception

On 11 October, The New York Commandery held a reception in honor of Companion Colonel Teddy Roosevelt's birthday. It was a sold-out gathering and several toasts in honor of the United States, the Armed Forces and our Companion, Teddy Roosevelt.

Teddy Roosevelt, the 26th President of the United States, formed the 1st Volunteer Cavalry in the Spanish-American War, and were sent to Cuba. Known as the "Rough Riders", they bravely charged up Kettle Hill on foot during the Battle of Santiago, making him the biggest hero of the war. He joined the New York Commandery in 1898.

COL Timothy J. MacDonaldFellow at the Council of Foreign Relations

Colonel Tim MacDonald, U.S. Army, most recently served as director of operations for Combined Joint Task Force - Horn of Africa at Camp Lemonier, Djibouti. He commanded the 18th Military Police Brigade headquartered in Vilseck, Germany, from June 2019 to June 2021. From June 2018 to June 2019,

Colonel MacDonald served as the provost marshal and director of protection for U.S. Army Europe Headquarters in Wiesbaden, Germany. From November 2016 to August 2017, he was the assistant executive officer to the headquarters, Department of the Army deputy chief of staff, G-3/5/7. Colonel MacDonald commanded the 502d Military Police Battalion (Criminal Investigations Division) from November 2014 to November 2016 at Fort Campbell, Kentucky. With two deployments in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, he served as the executive officer to the United States Forces Iraq chief of staff and as a Military Transition Team executive officer. Deployed for one tour in Kandahar, Afghanistan, Colonel MacDonald was the 4th Infantry Division provost marshal and chief of protection. From June 2007 to June 2009, he served as the director of operations for the 6th Recruiting Brigade in Las Vegas, Nevada. During a four-year break in active military service he worked in the aerospace industry in international business development and operations management. Colonel MacDonald earned a master's degrees in business and organizational security management from Webster University, a master's in national security strategy from the National War College, and a bachelor's degree in sociology from the State University of New York at Cortland.



Jason A. Otaño, Esq.General Counsel for the New York City Council

Jason serves as General Counsel for the New York City Council. He was commissioned in 2015 as an officer in the United States Army Reserve where he currently serves as a Captain in the Judge Advocate General's Corps. In his military capacity, he provides legal assistance to soldiers, their families, and retirees,

and is a legal advisor for domestic operations during times of emergency, such as the hurricane that ravaged his family's native Puerto Rico last year. Jason's father served in Vietnam with the 1st Cavalry Division.



MAJ Dave ForresterUnited States Military Academy, West Point


