












2022 Open Singles Golf Croquet Tournament, May 14

Mike got four of them playing the next round with four of our TCCC members. Then the other firefighter played in the next round. At 2 pm, about six of the police officers arrived. Then, we started having games with one police officer (playing blue) and one firefighter (playing red) per game with two of our members as partners. We double banked and started a new round every 30 minutes. By 4 pm, all the police officers and firefighters and about 35 TCCC members had played at least one game of golf croquet -- nobody left before 4 pm. We even let two boys who were sons of one of the police officers. Finally, the fire chief and the police chief played a game.
