AN EGGCELLENT TRADITION

According to the Gospel of John in the New Testament, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb where Jesus was buried and saw that it was empty. An angel told her that Jesus had risen.

There are several legends where Mary Magdalene plays a key role in the creation of the egg-dying tradition. There are many theories on why Easter eggs are dyed in different colours too. One version involves Mary Magdalene's trip to Jesus' tomb three days after his crucifixion. It is believed that she carried a basket of cooked eggs to share with the other women who was going to mourn at the tomb. When she arrived to find the stone rolled

away from the entrance and the tomb empty, the eggs in her basket is believed to have turned a wonderful shade of red.

There is an ancient tradition of staining the Easter eggs with the colour red in memory of the blood of Christ, shed during the time of the crucifixion. The Easter colors, however, are very traditional pastel shades of pink, blue, green, yellow and light purple.

Here at Joseph Dreamhouse we would like to honor this tradition and season of new life and generosity by continuing to provide our neighbors with food, just as Mary Magdalene did for her fellow mourners.

HOW REDUCING FOOD INSECURITY HELPS COMMUNITIES

Joseph Dreamhouse CDC serves low-to-moderate income families in sixteen towns/cities throughout both Broward and Miami-Dade Counties in South Florida, both of which have demonstrated high rates of poverty and resource insecurity compared to national averages. Joseph Dreamhouse CDC aims to address the cyclical relationship of food insecurity and impoverishment. A vital relationship exists between nutritional status, human capital, and economic standing. Malnutrition adversely affects the physiological and mental capacity of individuals, which in turn hampers productivity levels, making them and their

respective communities more susceptible to poverty. A twoway link exists between malnutrition and poverty, creating a vicious cycle with each fueling the other. The alleviation of one will aid in the alleviation of the other. Joseph Dreamhouse CDC firmly believes that alleviating food insecurity will place individuals on a positive trajectory, allowing them to allocate their hard earned resources towards paying for other essential bills. Furthermore, Joseph Dreamhouse CDC aims to improve community health outcomes through the distribution of healthy. nutrient-dense foods and thereby lowering the rate of malnourished families.
