## CLUB MESSAGE Written by Vice President Allen Morrow

If you missed our August meeting you missed the opportunity to hear to two excellent presentations. The first was a report on the status of the proposed salmon hatchery on the Deschutes River by Jim Tuggle. Jim gave a brief history of the hatchery that has been under study since the early 2000's. He pointed out that the Deschutes is an ideal location for a hatchery as there isn't and has never been a native salmon run on the river. The plans for the hatchery are to incorporate a learning center and a working hatchery. Jim said that the City of Tumwater has agreed to lease part of its Pioneer Park location for the project at a nominal cost. Funding help has also been offered by several organizations including the Squaxin Tribe. The legislature has included funding for the project in recent budgets. However, the project has stalled as WDFW continues to study the proposal. Jim is urging our PSA chapter to put pressure on WDFW to stop wasting money repeating studies previously completed and start building the hatchery.

The second speaker was Terry Rudnick who gave a presentation on fishing in the South Sound. He started his presentation by pointing out the number of returning salmon to this area in recent years has afforded fishers an excellent opportunity to bring home a salmon for dinner. Terry said that there are two distinct fishing methods used by local fishers. One, and his preferred method, is to troll and the other is to jig. He trolls close to shore using bait if dog fish aren't present or a spoon. This year a light or cream colored King Fisher spoon is his bait of choice as there are a lot of dogfish. He pointed out chinook can be found beginning in July followed by coho into September. Those who choose to jig typically use a small white jig.

Our next club project will be to provide kids an opportunity to catch a trout at the Washington State Fair in Puyallup. The Fair runs for four weeks beginning August 31 and the fish pond is open from 12:00 PM to 5:00 PM on Friday through Sunday every week as well as on Labor Day. We need a lot of volunteers to make the project a success. Those who volunteer will receive 2 free entry tickets to the Fair and free parking. 
