Habitat Care Center Clinic Update

We are excited to provide an update on the clinic that Habitat for Children Ministries opened on June 24th of last year! Since its inception, the clinic has made significant strides in improving the health and well-being of the families and children we serve.

Key Highlights

- The clinic has successfully expanded its range of services, including routine health blood pressure checks, immunizations and nutritional supplements. These services are designed to address the holistic needs of our community.
- 2. We have seen an increase in community engagement, with families actively participating in health education and Mobile Clinics that we host every two months. These initiatives empower families to take charge of their health and make informed decisions.
- 3. Our partnerships with local healthcare providers and organizations have strengthened our capacity to deliver quality care.
 Collaborations have enabled us to offer specialized services, such as eye exams, maternity checkups and pediatric consultations, enhancing our clinic's offerings.
- 4. We are proud to report that the clinic has successfully removed financial barriers to care, ensuring that essential health services are accessible to those most in need. So far, we able to provide medical services to those who do not have access to money to pay because of the generosity of our donors.









Clinic Update Cont.

Pregnant women in Haiti face a multitude of significant challenges that severely impact the health and the well-being of their babies. Limited access to quality healthcare facilities, particularly in rural areas, often leads to inadequate prenatal care and a lack of essential medical support during pregnancy and childbirth.

Many women struggle with malnutrition, exacerbated by poverty and food insecurity, which can result in complications for both the mother and child. Furthermore, the prevalence of unsafe birthing practices and a shortage of trained healthcare professionals contribute to high maternal and infant mortality rates. Social and economic instability, along with the aftermath of natural disasters, further complicate their circumstances, making it difficult for expectant mothers to receive the care and resources they desperately need.

The combination of these factors underscores the urgent need for comprehensive maternal health programs and support systems in Haiti to ensure the safety and health of mothers and their children.

The Harsh Reality

In Haiti, we often have to hold back tears when we see how pregnant women and babies are dying, during pregnancy, childbirth, and after childbirth especially in remote areas. The reasons are either that there are no qualified personnel to provide services, or that there are delays in having timely prenatal care and necessary examinations. In the Le Jeune community and other places we visit such as Losmamoune, Labi, Labelón, there are 2 main causes:

1. Women are hemorrhaging and losing a lot blood after giving birth.2: Women have high blood pressure (eclampsia) that creates repeated complications.

The largest hospital in the area in Hinche (the closet to the families that we serve) is consistently full and does not have enough space to receive them. The Habitat For Children Ministries staff would like to help these women get out of the situation where neither they nor their babies die in childbirth. As qualified personnel, our Habitat midwives are available and have the ability to provide the services, but do not have enough means to help them. quality medical equipment and supplies are needed to maintain services 7 days a week. We a currently providing programming three a week n Monday, Wednesday and Friday. We also provide a full clinic with multi-disciplines from all over the countryside on a bi-monthly basis. I myself as a nurse and midwife when needed, work with Habitat staff to reduce the mortality rate, but our means are insufficient.

Our Current Impact


Talking with some community members there is a positive impact on the health effects of the children and families we have served. Regular health screenings have led to early detection of medical issues, and families are reporting improved overall health and well-being.

Looking ahead, we are committed to further enhancing our services and outreach efforts. We plan to introduce additional health service programs and expand our efforts to better support our community's needs.

What's Next

- 1- We are planning to make provisions to open a Dental exam room.
- 2- We are working on establishing a small outpatient surgical room for on-site acute and minor surgeries.
 - 3- We are equipping our lab with all necessary instruments to provide all laboratory tests results including radiology.
