McVeytown Borough Authority Update

By now you probably have seen the contractors back in the area for the final phase of the sewer rehabilitation project. As always, we thank you for your patience while the project is being completed. If you had an area at your residence that still needs to be repaired that hasn't been and are wondering if it will be, please contact the sewer office at (717) 899-7436 with any questions.

On to new changes...the Authority along with the assistance of Gwin, Dobson and Foreman Engineers submitted a grant application on February 28, 2018 to DCED – PA Small Water and Sewer Program. If funded the funds will be used to develop an additional water supply source in response to the current water quality and quantity concerns of the existing water supply wells and to adequately conform to current regulatory requirements.

******ALERT***** OPERATION FAIRNESS PROJECT

As part of the Operation Fairness Project, the Mifflin County GIS and Tax Services Departments are in the process of comparing current tax cards with the new aerial images of McVeytown Borough. If any enhancements to or removal of structures are shown on your property that are not currently in the County Assessment System, you will receive a postcard notifying you that a field assessor will be coming to look at your parcel. If you don't receive a postcard, then no changes were found.

Such changes to properties may include new homes, additions, outbuildings, patios, decks, barns, etc. They will also be looking for buildings, etc, that have been removed, which could mean a savings to you, if it wasn't reported as removed.

This project will be done in all municipalities in Mifflin County. The County Commissioners thought it would be a beneficial project in order to be "fair" to all county residents.
