We continue to receive artifacts, photos, and items of interest for the museum. It is a great honor to have so many bring something to the museum. Just recently Roger Beck came, visited several hours, and talked about the old times and the Rockne Playboys and learning to play the accordion. He later brought a photo of himself (ten years old) holding the accordion his Uncle had given him; He remembered playing for Hugo and Dora Goertzi; ½ wedding. Merlin Goertzi; ½ steel guitar and speakers and Buford Catchingsi; ½ fiddle are on display. Those were the days!!

Also, Eugene Friske found photos of the altars in the church before remodeling in 1975 for the 100th anniversary of the parish. What a great find. No one could remember which small statues were on the side altars. Now we know. We have both of the small statues which were on Our Lady�s altar as well as the angel which stood beside the altar. We have St.Aloysius statue from Tom Bloomquist of Austin. It was on the opposite side altar. If anyone knows who purchased St. Michael the Archangel at a bazaar auction please let us know. That is the only statue we don�t have.

The Peter and Mary Goertz wooden bed, springs and cotton mattress are part of our collection. The mattress was made by Cecilia Hoffman and her mother, Mary, during World War II. The government provided the ticking, cotton, thread and needles, but the women in the community had to learn how to make the mattresses. Lemma Osborn went into Bastrop and learned how to make them and came back to teach others how to do it.
