"Rockneï;¹/₂s Living History," a project by Barbara Manson, Music teacher at Red Rock Elementary School, began in the fall of the 2003. "Elders" Minnie Bartsch, Murray Callahan, Erlene Goertz, Rev. Bernard Goertz, Thomas Goertz, and I were chosen to come to the school and tell about our family histories in the Rockne community. The stories were taped and students distilled the stories into texts that were used to create songs.

April 23, 2004 - Nearly 100 second and fourth graders who were involved in "Rockne�s Living History" project and their teachers had lunch at Hilbig Park. Afterwards they were guided on an educational tour of the museum, Phillip Goertz log cabin and an old machinery display by **John and Ann Adams**.

Thomas Goertz was an expert guide in relating the early history of the pioneer settlers. **Millie Moore and Margie Tucker** served lemonade to the students during lunch and helped Thomas in the Philip Goertz log cabin. **Daniel and Connie Lehman** guided tours in the museum while **Rev. Bernard Goertz** talked to the groups about the church history and altar display. **John and Ann Adams** entertained everyone with their old washing machines and butter churns. **I** was successful in keeping the groups moving. The students had many questions and all seemed genuinely interested in all phases of the tours. They were orderly, polite and inquisitive. It was a wonderful learning experience for all involved.

May 11, 2004 - Elders were invited back to school for a "Celebration of Place: Rockneï $_{i}$ ¹/₂s Living History." The program was a huge success and we hope that **Barbara Manson** will continue with this special educational project.

Dedication of the Wolf Cemetery located on the property of **Barbara Seidel**, near Rockne, Texas, took place on Sunday, May 16th. This cemetery contains the graves of **John Wolf, Sr.** (1811�1868) and his wife, **Catherine** (1809�1869) and several family members.

Rev. Kris Bugno and Deacon Roger Muehr of Sacred Heart Church, Rockne, conducted a beautiful ceremony and blessed the graves.

It was a very hot day, without benefit of cloud cover or shade, so I tried to make my welcoming remarks and introductions brief. **Mitch Wolf** talked about his ancestors and family. He thanked the **grandchildren of Henry Martin Wolf** for funding the improvement project. He also thanked **Minnie Bartsch, Barbara Seidel and Claude Wilhelm** for their contributions. **Mitch,** himself, researched the entire project.

I took the opportunity to praise RHA and the community for the preservation work they accomplish. This combined effort is an example of the community working together to preserve family history.

Minnie Bartsch repeated **Barbara Seidelï;**¹/₂**s** story that epitomizes the spirit of the Rockne community. "When **Barbara** and her brother **Claude** were young, their mother took them to the grave site to pray the Rosary every year on All Souls Day. Barbaraï;¹/₂**s** mother, **Margaret Wilhelm**, did not want the people buried there to be forgotten."

After the dedication, everyone was invited to the Rockne Museum at Hilbig Park for refreshments. About 50 people enjoyed visiting the Museum and log cabin.

Flag Day

Gerri Martinez, Representative for Catholic Life Insurance, Branch #12, conducted a Flag Day Ceremony at Hilbig Park on Saturday, June 12, 2004.

In 1996, **Hochheim Prairie Insurance, Branch 51** donated a Flag Pole that was erected beside the Phillip Goertz log cabin. Since that time, **Gerri Martinez,** Representative of Catholic Life Insurance, has been donating flags to RHA and planning programs. She stated that Catholic Life takes great pride in honoring our nation�s flag and keeping up the awareness of how important the Pledge of Allegiance is to our Country.

The flag was raised and then lowered to half staff in honor of **President Ronald Reagan by Charles Nelson and Bryan Goertz.** Gerri Martinez let The Pledge of Allegiance and the Star Spangled Banner.

Community Service Representative for Blue Bonnet Electric, **Beau White,** talked about the history of the flag. His presentation included some little known but interesting facts about the flag and how Flag Day came to be celebrated.

Bryan Goertz, board member of RHA and Bastrop County District Attorney spoke passionately of his feelings for the unity of the Rockne community, remembering what our ancestors endured in order to come to this county for freedom. He said, "When I look around, standing here at Hilbig Park, and see the Church, the Phillip Goertz log cabin, the Rockne Museum and particularly my Grandpa's store, (**Fred Hilbig & Wm. Hilbig and Sons General Store**) well . . . I can�t tell you what it all means to me."

Lloyd Probst, his son and grandson, visiting from Alabama, were among the fifty people who adjourned to the museum, after the ceremony, for refreshments and to spend time viewing the displays.

Stained Glass Windows

Four window panes, each 24" x 24", for the window at the north end of the museum above the old Church altar, were ordered last August and hopefully they will be in place soon. RHA has tentatively planned a Blessing Ceremony on October 2, 2004, at 11:00 a.m.

Lehman Cabin Restoration

Melvin Driskill, Daniel and Connie Lehman, Tim Tucker of Tucker Homes, Charlie Nelson and I met at Hilbig Park on March 10th to discuss the restoration of the Lehman cabin. Subsequent meetings have taken place and Tim Tucker has volunteered to reconstruct the cabin at cost. Many of the cedar logs will have to be replaced and the good news is that the **Meuth Family** has donated part of **Richard Meuthï**;¹/₂s old house for the back room. The first step is to have the fence on the south side of Hilbig Park moved to include the property donated by **George and Cindy Goertz.** RHA has set aside some funds for this project but a matching fund is still needed. Timmy has donated his time but the outstanding cost will still be for labor. The cabin will be located next to FM 535 in Hilbig Park.

The Phillip Goertz Log Cabin

Wayne Meuth of Design Drywall Inc. has volunteered to look into a method of preserving and protecting the logs with Perma Chink. He will give us a bid so that we can budget this project. Wayne said he has no expertise with log cabins but is willing to investigate and help us out. We are grateful for his interest and support.
