New Testament Reading: 1 Timothy 4:6-16

If you put these instructions before the brothers and sisters, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, nourished on the words of the faith and of the sound teaching that you have followed.

Have nothing to do with profane myths and old wives' tales.

Train yourself in godliness, for, while physical training is of some value, godliness is valuable in every way, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come.

The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance.

For to this end we toil and struggle, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe.

These are the things you must insist on and teach.

Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity.

Until I arrive, give attention to the public reading of scripture, to exhorting, to teaching.

Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you through prophecy with the laying on of hands by the council of elders.

Put these things into practice, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress.

Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; continue in these things, for in doing this you will save both yourself and your hearers.

The Gospel: Luke 12:42-48

“Who then is the faithful and prudent manager whom his master will put in charge of his slaves, to give them their allowance of food at the proper time?

Blessed is that slave whom his master will find at work when he arrives.

Truly I tell you, he will put that one in charge of all his possessions.

But if that slave says to himself, ‘My master is delayed in coming,’

and if he begins to beat the other slaves, men and women,

and to eat and drink and get drunk,

the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect him

and at an hour that he does not know,

and will cut him in pieces,

and put him with the unfaithful.

That slave who knew what his master wanted,

but did not prepare himself or do what was wanted,

will receive a severe beating.

But the one who did not know

and did what deserved a beating

will receive a light beating.

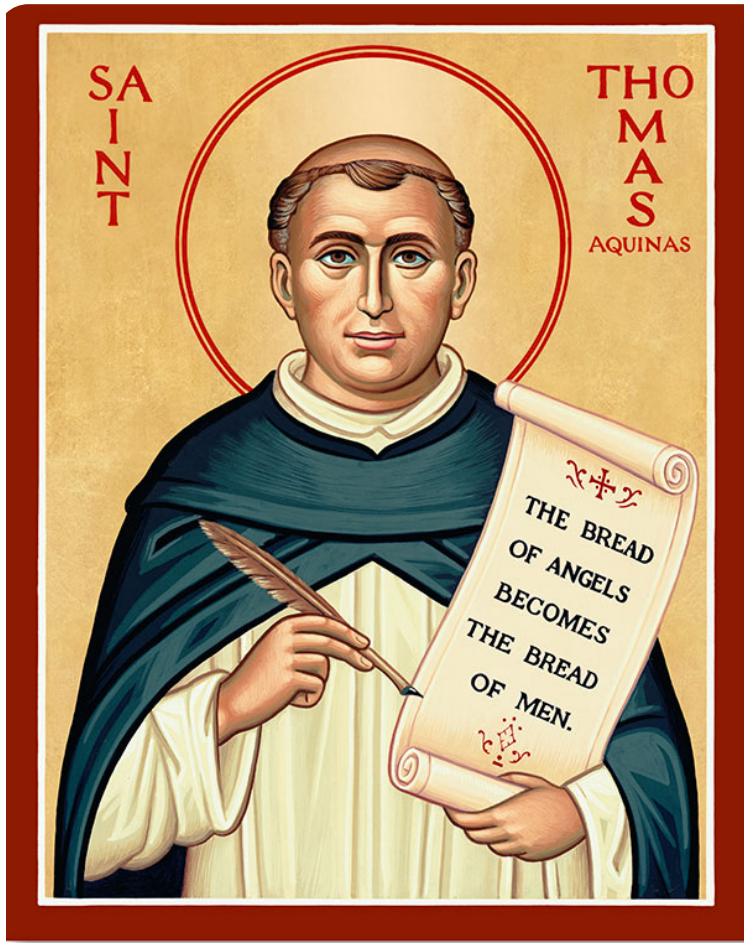

Saint Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274) – Feast Day: Jan. 28.



Saint Thomas Aquinas stands as one of the greatest teachers, thinkers, and saints in the history of the Church. Honored with the titles **Doctor of the Church** and **Angelic Doctor**, he is especially remembered for showing that faith and reason are not opposed, but work together to reveal truth. His life and writings continue to guide Christians seeking to love God with both heart and mind.

Thomas was born around 1225 in Roccasecca, Italy, to a noble family. His parents intended him for a prestigious life, possibly as a Benedictine abbot, and sent him to study at the famous Abbey of Monte Cassino. From a young age, Thomas showed a deep desire to understand God, often asking the simple but profound question: “What is God?” This question would shape his entire life.

Against his family’s wishes, Thomas joined the Dominican Order, a community devoted to preaching, study, and poverty. His family strongly opposed this decision and even confined him for over a year in an attempt to change his mind. Thomas remained firm, using the time for prayer and reflection. His perseverance revealed his deep commitment to God’s call, even when it required sacrifice.

After his release, Thomas studied in Paris and Cologne under Saint Albert the Great, one of the most respected scholars of the time. Though Thomas was quiet and humble, his brilliance soon became evident. He possessed an extraordinary ability to unite philosophy—especially the works of Aristotle—with Christian theology. At a time when some feared human reason might weaken faith, Thomas showed that truth discovered through reason could never contradict truth revealed by God.

Thomas Aquinas’s most famous work, the *Summa Theologica*, remains one of the most important theological writings in Christian history. Written to help students understand the faith, it explores God, creation, human nature, morality, Christ, and the sacraments in a clear and orderly way. Rather than presenting faith as blind belief, Thomas encouraged careful thought, honest questions, and humble trust in God’s revelation.

Despite his intellectual gifts, Thomas lived a life of deep holiness. He was devoted to prayer, celebrated the Eucharist with great reverence, and had a profound love for Christ. Near the end of his life, after a mystical experience during Mass, he stopped writing, saying that all he had written seemed like straw compared to what God had revealed to him. This moment reminds us that, for Thomas, knowledge was always meant to lead to worship.

Saint Thomas Aquinas died in 1274 while traveling to attend the Second Council of Lyons. He was canonized in 1323 and later declared a Doctor of the Church. Today, he is the **patron saint of students, scholars, universities, and theologians.**

Saint Thomas Aquinas teaches us that loving God includes using the mind He gave us. In a world that often separates faith from reason, his life proclaims that true wisdom is found when intellect is guided by faith, and faith is deepened by understanding. His example continues to inspire the Church to seek truth with humility, courage, and trust in God.

O Saint Thomas Aquinas, faithful servant of God and humble seeker of truth, pray for us as we strive to love the Lord with all our heart, soul, and mind. Help us to seek wisdom with humility, to unite faith with reason, and to use our gifts for the glory of God and the good of others.
Through your intercession, may we grow in understanding, holiness, and trust in God's eternal truth. Amen.
