For 4–5-year-old (who may not be attending Kindergarten)
Class size limited to 16 children

• The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a Montessori-based faith formation program for Pre-K children ages 4 and 5 years old. This hands-on program, in a specially prepared environment called the "Atrium," nurtures and educates the whole child in the ways of the Catholic faith. It expands the understanding of Scripture and Liturgy with the use of many sensory materials including the infancy narrative figures, a raised surface map of the land of Israel, a model altar, and a model-size baptismal font, to name a few. This concrete method of presenting the Faith is similar to the way the Church teaches us through the sacraments, holy water, incense, and statues.

A combination of Catechesis, Spiritual Formation, as well as a set of speakers that give the different sides of humanity that need our help, that need our attention. Our middle school program will guide our youth to "see their faith realized" in their own lives and in the lives of others.

Your 6-8th Grader will hear a several speakers each year that show us the different sides of humanity that need our help or show us how to deepen our faith with God assisting them in their journey of faith.

At Home course work is offered at your own pace, but a syllabus is provided to assist you so you can do your work in anytime that works for you during the week.

Your work is accountable with a fall and a spring assessment that you do online. This is required to go onto the next grade and prove you have done the work.

NOTE: A student in a sport in the fall but able to attend our spring session may do At Home and jump back into the in-person classes. You must have permission for this and let the Director of Religious Ed know your plans.

If your student is in 6-8th Grades, they must attend the first day of class on September 29th with our speaker and all other speaker dates listed on our calendar.

You will receive a syllabus to follow to keep you on track throughout the school year. All work must be completed by May 31st, 2024. Your workbook should be returned to the office by May 31st, 2025, if you cannot complete it by this date, please reach out to Krista Joseph, the DRE, to make arrangements.

Assessments in the Fall and in the Spring are required. A link to the assessment will be emailed to you directly from the Loyola Press website to a parent email address that was provided in your registration form. We do not collect student email addresses per the Diocesan Safe Environment rules.

These assessments are open books and working with other students and friends is encouraged. Talking about your faith is ALWAYS a good thing and encouraged! If a student does better at taking assessments on paper instead of online, please email the DRE or a PDF of the test.

We offer this program to students who have missed their First Communion and the 7th Grade year that prepares them for Confirmation which takes place in 8th Grade.

We typically place the child in their present grade. In addition, they meet about 10 times starting in January of the school year to get them caught up with their Sacraments. Depending on what grade they are in, we decide together with the parents when the best time to receive these Sacraments is.
