

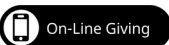

SAFE ENVIRONMENT COMPLIANCE UPDATE

Our parish is blessed with many generous volunteers who help make our ministries, programs, and liturgies possible. As we continue our commitment to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all children and vulnerable persons, we are preparing for the Diocese of Columbus' updated Safe Environment requirements.

All volunteers will have an opportunity to be fingerprinted at Our Lady of Victory on January 8, 2026. This and other steps help ensure that our parish remains a place of trust, protection, and faith for every member of our community.

Background Check Requirements

To meet diocesan policy, the following background checks are required for volunteers:

- BCI (Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation) background check – Required for all volunteers.
- FBI background check – In addition to BCI, FBI is required for volunteers who have lived outside the state of Ohio at any point in the past five years.

If you currently volunteer, or plan to volunteer in the future, we warmly encourage you to **check that your VIRTUS account is active and up to date, and that your background checks have been completed within the required timeframes.**

Please contact the parish office with any questions or for assistance completing your background check or VIRTUS requirements.

Our staff is happy to help guide you through the process.

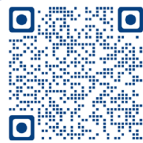

New Testament Reading: Hebrews 7:11-19

If perfection had been attainable through the levitical priesthood – for the people received the law under this priesthood – what further need would there have been to speak of another priest arising according to the order of Melchizedek, rather than one according to the order of Aaron? For when there is a change in the priesthood, there is necessarily a change in the law as well. Now the one of whom these things are spoken belonged to another tribe, from which no one has ever served at the altar. For it is evident that our Lord was descended from Judah, and in connection with that tribe Moses said nothing about priests. It is even more obvious when another priest arises, resembling Melchizedek, one who has become a priest, not through a legal requirement concerning physical descent, but through the power of an indestructible life. For it is attested of him, “You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek.” There is, on the one hand, the abrogation of an earlier commandment because it was weak and ineffectual (for the law made nothing perfect); there is, on the other hand, the introduction of a better hope, through which we approach God.

The Gospel: Luke 2:41-52

Every year Jesus’ parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day’s journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, “Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.” He said to them, “Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father’s house?” But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favor.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton - Feast Day: Jan. 4

January 4 marks the feast of Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first native-born citizen of the United States to be canonized a saint.

Her story is one of remarkable faith lived out in ordinary circumstances—marriage, motherhood, grief, work, and service—making her a powerful witness for modern Christians.

Born in New York City in 1774, Elizabeth Ann Bayley was raised in a cultured and socially prominent family.

She received a strong education and developed a lifelong love of reading and learning. At the age of nineteen, she married William Magee Seton, and together they welcomed five children.



Their early married life was happy, but it was also marked by increasing hardship as William's health declined and the family business failed.

During a stay in Italy while seeking treatment for her husband's tuberculosis, Elizabeth encountered the Catholic faith in a deeply personal way. She was moved by the devotion she witnessed, particularly belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

After William's death, Elizabeth returned to New York a widow with five young children and very limited means. Despite social pressure and misunderstanding from friends and family, she followed the call she felt from God and entered the Catholic Church in 1805.

Her conversion cost her dearly. She lost financial support and social standing, yet she never lost her trust in God's providence.

"The will of God be done," became her guiding prayer. Elizabeth believed that God was present and active even in suffering, and she encouraged others to see trials not as abandonment, but as invitations to deeper faith.

Recognizing the need for Catholic education, Elizabeth began teaching children, eventually founding the first free Catholic school in the United States. In 1809, she established the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph's in Emmitsburg, Maryland—the first religious congregation for women founded in the U.S. From this community grew a vast network of Catholic schools, hospitals, and charitable works that continue to serve millions today.

As a religious sister and superior, Elizabeth remained deeply maternal, attentive to both spiritual and practical needs. Her letters reveal a woman of warmth, humor, and realism—someone who knew hardship well but refused to let it extinguish hope. She once wrote, “Faith lifts the soul above trials, or at least gives it strength to endure them.”

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton died in 1821 at the age of forty-six. She was canonized in 1975, affirming her legacy as a model of holiness lived in everyday life. She is the patron saint of Catholic schools, educators, widows, and converts.

As we begin a new calendar year, her feast invites us to place the unknown months ahead into God's hands. Like St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, may we learn to trust God not only when life is peaceful, but especially when it is uncertain—confident that His grace is always enough.



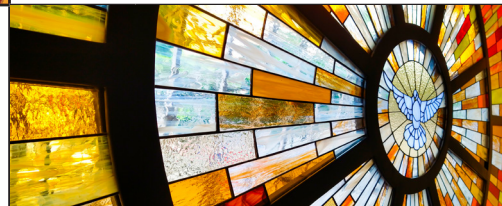

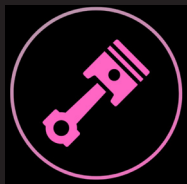
