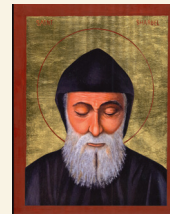
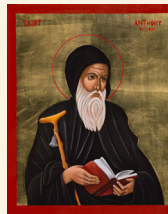
COMMUNITY KITCHEN, INC.

Confirmation – We will be Confirming 4th, 5th, and 8th Grade students this 2026-2027 School Year. The Diocese of Columbus has NEW directives to move Confirmation to 4th Grade. See the video from Bishop Fernandes on our website with more information about this. Over the next two years, we will be confirming Grades 4 through 8 to get everyone caught up. In 2027-2028, we will confirm 4th, 7th, and 8th Grade.

LITURGY AND MUSIC

Dear Parish Family,

Vatican II changed the center of gravity of liturgical music. Before the reform, especially in many places, the model often placed the priest and choir in the role of leading the formal liturgy while the people listened more than they sang. Vatican II encouraged a fuller vision: the whole assembly is meant to participate actively in the Mass, especially through sung responses, acclamations, and the common parts of the rite.



What does “participation” mean? It does not mean everyone must sing everything all the time. It means the congregation is not meant to be passive spectators, but a praying body joined together in the action of worship. The Council wanted music that fits the liturgy itself and helps the faithful unite voice, mind, and heart in prayer. This is why the conversation about church music becomes so intense.

Once the goal is full participation, people naturally disagree about what best serves that goal. Some value traditional chant and classical sacred music because they express reverence, beauty, and continuity with the Church’s heritage. Others emphasize accessibility, so that ordinary people can sing easily in their own language and take part more fully. This is where the word “congregational” matters. Congregational music is music the whole assembly can realistically sing, not just a trained choir.

Vatican II encouraged this shift by giving greater importance to the people’s sung responses and common acclamations. That means the question is not only about style, but about how the Church prays together and how worship is experienced by the faithful.

So, the real question is not whether the Church should preserve sacred tradition or promote shared participation. It is how to do both well. Vatican II did not reject the Church’s inherited sacred music; it called the Church to widen participation while keeping worship truly sacred, prayerful, and worthy of God.

As your music director, I believe this gives us a beautiful responsibility. We are called to choose music that is spiritually rich, musically strong, and prayerfully accessible. When we sing together well, the liturgy becomes not a performance to watch, but an act of worship we offer together to the Lord. Of all the churches that I have served in my 40 years of ministry, Our Lady of Victory is the best in participation at every Mass. God Bless Us!

We are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us;

The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him.

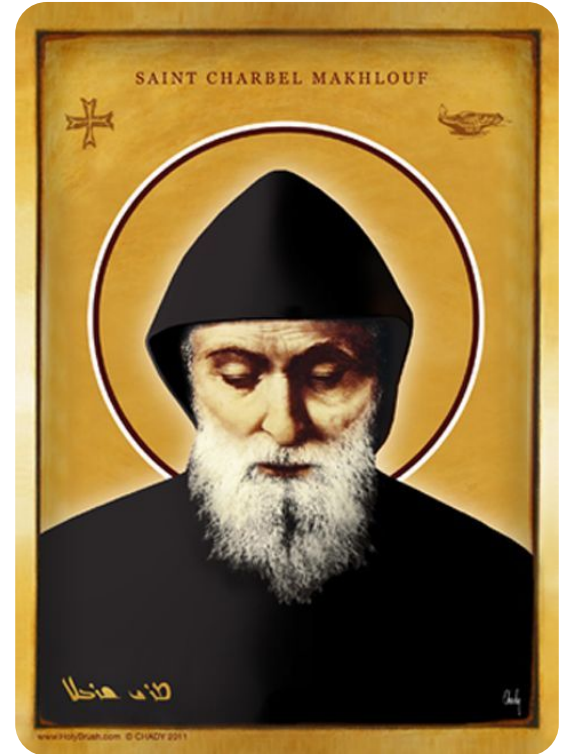
Then he began to say to them,

Saint Sharbel Makhoul: A Saint of Silence, Prayer, and Miracles

As we celebrate the Feast of Saint Sharbel Makhoul on July 21, we give thanks for the life of one of the Church's most beloved modern saints. Though he lived a quiet and hidden life in the mountains of Lebanon, his witness to holiness continues to inspire millions of Christians throughout the world. Saint Sharbel reminds us that true greatness is found not in recognition or success, but in complete devotion to God.

Saint Sharbel was born as Youssef Antoun Makhoul on May 8, 1828, in the small village of Bekaa Kфра, Lebanon. Raised in a deeply faithful Maronite Catholic family, he developed a love for prayer from an early age. Following the example of two holy uncles who lived as hermits, Youssef felt called to dedicate his life entirely to Christ.



At the age of twenty-three, he quietly left his family home and entered the Monastery of Our Lady of Mayfouq. Upon becoming a monk, he took the name Sharbel, after a second-century Christian martyr. Later he transferred to the Monastery of Saint Maron in Annaya, where he spent many years in prayer, manual labor, study, and humble service. In 1859 he was ordained a priest.

Saint Sharbel's greatest desire was to belong completely to God. He faithfully celebrated the Holy Eucharist, spent long hours in silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, and practiced extraordinary humility and self-discipline. He rarely spoke unless necessary, preferring to let his life proclaim the Gospel. Those who knew him admired his kindness, gentleness, and deep love for God.

In 1875, after years of monastic life, Father Sharbel received permission to live as a hermit near the monastery. For the next twenty-three years, he embraced a life of solitude, fasting, and continual prayer. His days revolved around the celebration of Mass, meditation on Scripture, and interceding for the needs of the world. Hidden from public attention, he became rich in God's grace.

On December 16, 1898, while celebrating the Divine Liturgy, Father Sharbel suffered a stroke. He died eight days later, on Christmas Eve, with his thoughts fixed on Christ. His fellow monks buried him in the monastery cemetery, believing they had laid to rest a holy man.

Soon after his death, remarkable events began to occur. Witnesses reported an extraordinary light shining over his tomb, and many people who prayed through his intercession experienced miraculous healings and spiritual conversions. Pilgrims from every continent now travel to the Monastery of Saint Maron in Annaya, seeking hope, healing, and a deeper relationship with God.

Recognizing the many signs of holiness and carefully investigated miracles, Pope Paul VI beatified Saint Sharbel in 1965 and canonized him in 1977. Today he is honored not only by Maronite Catholics but by Christians of every tradition, as well as non-Christians who have witnessed his powerful intercession.

In a world filled with constant noise and endless distractions, Saint Sharbel invites us to rediscover the beauty of silence. His life reminds us that holiness is possible for anyone who faithfully follows Christ with an open and trusting heart. His example teaches us that prayer is not simply speaking to God but being silent before him and listening to His voice. We may not be called to live as hermits, but we are all called to set aside time each day for prayer, Scripture, and quiet reflection. In those moments, God renews our hearts and strengthens our faith.

As we honor Saint Sharbel this week, may we ask for his intercession. May his unwavering faith encourage us to trust God more deeply, his humility inspire us to serve others with love, and his life of prayer lead us closer to Jesus Christ. Through the prayers of Saint Sharbel, may our parish and our families grow in holiness, peace, and hope. Amen.

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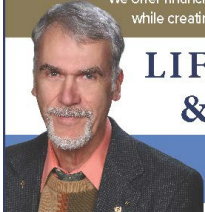
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
