New Testament Reading: Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs — in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

The Gospel: John 14:15-20

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you. "I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you.

St. Eleutherius and His Mother - Feast day: May 25

Among the many inspiring saints of the early Church are Saint Eleutherius and his mother, Saint Anthia. Their story is one of deep faith, family devotion, courage under persecution, and unwavering trust in Jesus Christ. Though they lived many centuries ago, their example continues to encourage Christians to remain faithful even during times of suffering and uncertainty.

Saint Eleutherius was born in Rome during the second century, at a time when Christians were often persecuted for their beliefs. His mother, Saint Anthia, was a Christian woman who loved God deeply and raised her son in the faith from an early age. Anthia understood the importance of teaching her child about Christ, prayer, and the Gospel. Her guidance helped shape Eleutherius into a faithful disciple and courageous leader within the Church.



According to Christian tradition, Eleutherius showed remarkable holiness even as a young boy. Because of his intelligence, maturity, and devotion, he was entrusted with responsibilities in the Church at an early age. He studied under holy teachers and became known for his wisdom and dedication to serving God.

As he grew older, Eleutherius was ordained a deacon, then a priest, and eventually became a bishop while still quite young. Though young in years, he was mature in faith and committed to preaching the message of Christ fearlessly. He became known for his compassionate leadership and his ability to inspire others to embrace Christianity.

During this period of Roman history, Christians faced severe danger. Refusing to worship the Roman gods or the emperor often led to imprisonment, torture, or death. Yet Eleutherius remained steadfast. He boldly proclaimed the Gospel despite knowing the risks involved.

Tradition tells us that many people were converted through his preaching and witness. His holiness and courage impressed even those who opposed Christianity. However, Roman authorities eventually arrested him because of his faith and his refusal to abandon Christ.

Eleutherius endured harsh treatment and torture for refusing to renounce Christianity. Stories of the saints describe various attempts to force him to deny his faith, but he remained calm and faithful through every trial. Those who witnessed his courage were amazed by his peace and trust in God.

His mother, Saint Anthia, stayed close to her son during his suffering. Rather than urging him to save himself by denying Christ, she encouraged him to remain faithful. Her strength as a mother is one of the most moving parts of their story. Anthia demonstrated the kind of faith that places complete trust in God above all earthly fears.

Eventually, both Eleutherius and Anthia were martyred for their Christian faith. They gave their lives rather than deny Jesus Christ. The Church honors them not only for their sacrifice but also for their example of family faithfulness. Together they remind us how important it is for parents to pass on the faith to their children and to encourage them in holiness.

The witness of Saint Anthia is especially meaningful for Christian parents today. In a world filled with distractions and challenges, parents continue to carry the important responsibility of teaching children about God through prayer, example, kindness, and love. Anthia's life shows that the faith of a parent can profoundly shape the future of a child.

Saint Eleutherius reminds us that age does not limit holiness. Young people are capable of deep faith, leadership, and courage. God calls every generation – young and old alike – to live boldly for Christ.

As we remember Saints Eleutherius and Anthia, may their example inspire our families to grow stronger in faith, prayer, and trust in God. May we learn from their courage to remain faithful to Christ in all circumstances, confident that God's love is greater than every trial.


