




THE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES OF THE ROSARY BIBLE STUDY






New Testament Reading: 2Corinthians 4:5-15

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake.

For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.

We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our mortal flesh.

So death is at work in us, but life in you. But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — "I believed, and so I spoke" — we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus

will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence.

Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. For while we live,

we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — "I believed, and so I spoke" — we also believe, and so we speak,

because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

The Gospel: John 1:35-42

The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!"

The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.

When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?"

They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?"

He said to them, "Come and see."

They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day.

It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.


One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah"

(which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said,

"You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).

St. Athanasius of Alexandria - Feast Day Jan. 18



Bishop, Confessor, and Doctor of the Church

St. Athanasius of Alexandria is one of the most influential figures in the history of Christianity, remembered above all as a fearless defender of the divinity of Jesus Christ. Born in Alexandria, Egypt, around the year 296, Athanasius grew up in one of the great intellectual centers of the ancient world. From a young age, he demonstrated remarkable brilliance, deep faith, and a profound love for the Church.

As a deacon, Athanasius served under Bishop Alexander of Alexandria and accompanied him to the Council of Nicaea in 325. At this pivotal gathering, the Church confronted the Arian heresy, which claimed that Christ was not fully divine but a created being. Athanasius emerged as one of the strongest voices opposing this teaching. He boldly proclaimed that Jesus Christ is “consubstantial with the Father,” meaning of the same divine essence. This truth became the foundation of the Nicene Creed, still professed by Christians today.

In 328, Athanasius was elected Bishop of Alexandria, a position he would hold for forty-five turbulent years. His unwavering defense of orthodox doctrine made him many enemies, both political and ecclesiastical. As a result, Athanasius was exiled from his diocese no fewer than five times, spending a total of about seventeen years in exile. Despite these hardships, he remained steadfast, earning the famous description *Athanasius contra mundum*—“Athanasius against the world.”

Alongside his pastoral leadership, Athanasius was a prolific writer. His most well-known work, *On the Incarnation*, beautifully explains why God became man in Jesus Christ. In it, Athanasius teaches that the Son of God took on human nature to restore what had been corrupted by sin and death. Through Christ’s death and resurrection, humanity is renewed and brought back into communion with God. His writings continue to shape Christian theology and devotion across centuries.

St. Athanasius was also instrumental in promoting monasticism. He wrote *The Life of St. Anthony*, a biography of the great desert monk, which inspired countless men and women to pursue lives of prayer, simplicity, and devotion to God. This work played a major role in spreading monastic ideals throughout the Christian world.

The feast day of St. Athanasius is celebrated on **May 2** in the Roman Catholic Church and on **January 18** in Eastern Christian traditions. He is honored as a **Doctor of the Church**, a title given to saints whose teaching is of particular importance for the universal Church.

St. Athanasius is regarded as the **patron saint of theologians, defenders of the faith, and those suffering persecution for their beliefs**. His life stands as a powerful witness to courage, perseverance, and fidelity to truth. In every age, St. Athanasius reminds the Church that the truth of Christ is worth defending, even in the face of overwhelming opposition.

Loving God,

through the faithful witness of St. Athanasius,
you strengthened your Church to proclaim the
truth of Christ.

Grant us the courage to stand firm in faith,
the wisdom to know your truth,
and the grace to live as witnesses to your love.






