

RELIGIOUS ED REGISTRATION

<u>Registration began online August 11th.</u> The Registration Link and information will be emailed to you as well as posted on the OLV Website. *PLEASE* register ASAP so you can reserve your child's spot in their class. **If you are new to the parish, you need to be a REGISTERED** member of OLV for your children to attend Religious Education. Contact Krista Joseph to begin the registration process.

<u>Please remember</u> that our <u>First Communion Program is a 2-YEAR program</u> with preparation <u>beginning in 1st Grade</u> – It is required that your child attend 1st Grade in order to make their First Communion in 2nd Grade. Our <u>Confirmation Program is also a 2-YEAR</u> <u>program</u> with preparation <u>beginning in 7th Grade</u> and Confirmation in 8th Grade.

**If your child did not attend class last year in 1st or 7th grade, please contact Krista ASAP so she can arrange for your child to get caught up to receive their Sacraments on time.

Our PreK Class is limited to 16 Children and those spots fill up fast! Please see our website for information describing all the programs at OLV.

ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (OCIA)

The process in which adults enter the Roman Catholic Church is known as OCIA, "The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults."

Who is eligible for this process?

The Unbaptized. The primary focus of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is on those who are not already Christian and have had little or no religious education.

Baptized but un-catechized are those who were baptized in the Roman Catholic Church but need further catechetical instruction to celebrate the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist.

Those Seeking Full Communion with the Catholic Church are baptized, practicing Christians from other Christian Traditions who seek entry, or full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.



"Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" is a well-known Christian hymn written by Walter Chalmers Smith, a Scottish minister of the Free Church of Scotland. It was first published in 1867 in his collection, Hymns of Christ and the Christian Life. The hymn is based on 1 Timothy 1:17, which speaks of the "King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God." It is most commonly sung to the tune "St. Denio," a traditional Welsh ballad tune.


Key Aspects of the Hymn's History:

- Author: Walter Chalmers Smith (1824-1908) was a prolific writer of poetry and hymns, but "Immortal, Invisible" is the only one that remains widely used today.
- Inspiration: The hymn is directly inspired by the biblical text of 1 Timothy 1:17.
- Original Publication: It was first published in 1867 in Smith's collection of hymns.
- Initial Form: The original version had six stanzas, but it is now more commonly sung with four.
- Standard Version: The four-stanza version became widely adopted after being included in The English Hymnal (1906).
- Tune: The hymn is most frequently paired with the tune *St. Denio*, which has its own history as a Welsh folk song.
- Themes: The hymn explores the mystery of God's nature, focusing on His immortality, invisibility, wisdom, and transcendence. It also highlights God's attributes of justice, goodness, and love.

New Testament Reading: Ephesians 3:1-13

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles — for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power.

Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places.

This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him. I pray therefore that you may not lose heart over my sufferings for you; they are your glory.

The Gospel: Matthew 15:21-28

Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." But he did not answer her at all.

And his disciples came and urged him, saying,

"Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us."

He answered,

"I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel."

But she came and knelt before him, saying,

"Lord, help me."

Jesus answered,

"It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs."

She said, "Yes, Lord,

yet even the dogs eat the crumbs

that fall from their masters' table."

Then Jesus answered her,

"Woman, great is your faith!

Let it be done for you as you wish."

And her daughter was healed instantly.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux (1090-1153) - Feast Day: Aug. 20

St. Bernard of Clairvaux is remembered as one of the great saints of the Middle Ages, a man whose love for Christ and His Church helped shape spiritual life the Europe. Born in 1090 Dijon, France, near Bernard was the son of noble parents and grew up in a home of privilege. From an early age, however, he showed a deep sensitivity to prayer and a desire for holiness. His mother, Aleth, who was herself a woman of great faith, instilled in him a devotion to God and Our Lady.



In 1113, at the age of 23, Bernard entered the newly founded Cistercian abbey of Cîteaux. His enthusiasm for religious life was so strong that he persuaded about thirty companions—brothers, relatives, and friends-to join him. This youthful zeal gave fresh life to the Cistercian movement, which had been struggling to survive. Only three years after entering, Bernard was chosen to lead a group of monks to establish a new community. He founded the abbey of Clairvaux in a remote valley, which soon became one of the most influential monastic centers in Europe.

As abbot of Clairvaux, Bernard combined gentleness with firm discipline. His life was marked by simplicity, poverty, and an intense love of Christ crucified. He devoted himself to preaching, writing, and guiding both monks and laypeople in the spiritual life. His sermons on the Song of Songs remain classics of mystical theology, expressing a profound union of love between the soul and God. He also had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, calling her the "Star of the Sea" who guides Christians safely to her Son.

Bernard's influence extended far beyond the walls of Clairvaux. Popes, bishops, kings, and ordinary Christians alike sought his counsel. He helped heal divisions in the Church and worked tirelessly for unity. In 1145, one of his own monks, Bernard's spiritual son Bernard of Pisa, was elected Pope under the name Eugene III. Bernard encouraged and guided him, writing his famous treatise On Consideration, which remains a spiritual classic for Church leaders.

Though he longed for a life of quiet prayer, Bernard was often called into public affairs. He preached fervently in defense of the faith against heresies, and in 1146, he was asked to inspire support for the Second Crusade. His eloquent words stirred thousands to take up the cross, though the outcome of the crusade brought him sorrow. Through it all, Bernard remained humble, reminding others that God's ways are often beyond human understanding.

After a life of tireless service, Bernard died on August 20, 1153, at the age of 63. He was canonized only 21 years later, in 1174, by Pope Alexander III, a sign of the universal recognition of his holiness. In 1830, Pope Pius VIII declared him a Doctor of the Church for his profound writings on theology and spirituality.

St. Bernard of Clairvaux continues to inspire Christians today with his burning love for Jesus and Mary, his humility, and his deep trust in God's providence. His feast day is celebrated on August 20. May his words and example lead us, as he once prayed, "from ourselves to God, from God to our neighbor, and from our neighbor back to God."


