

SAFE ENVIRONMENT COMPLIANCE UPDATE

Our parish is blessed with many generous volunteers who help make our ministries, programs, and liturgies possible. As we continue our commitment to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all children and vulnerable persons, we are preparing for the Diocese of Columbus' updated Safe Environment requirements. All volunteers are asked to be fully compliant with Protecting God's Children training and complete the required background checks by January 2, 2026. These steps help ensure that our parish remains a place of trust, protection, and faith for every member of our community.

Background Check Requirements

To meet diocesan policy, the following background checks are required for volunteers:

- BCI (Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation) background check – required for all volunteers.
- FBI background check – in addition to BCI, FBI is required for volunteers who have lived outside the state of Ohio at any point in the past five years.

If you currently volunteer, or plan to volunteer in the future, we warmly encourage you to **check that your VIRTUS account is active and up to date, and that your background checks have been completed within the required timeframes.**

Please contact the Parish Office with any questions or for assistance completing your background check or VIRTUS requirements.

Our staff is happy to help guide you through the process.

New Testament Reading: Revelation 21:9-10, 21-27

Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls full of the seven last plagues came and said to me, "Come, I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb."

And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

And the twelve gates are twelve pearls, each of the gates is a single pearl, and the street of the city is pure gold, transparent as glass.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb.

And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

The nations will walk by its light,

and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day — and there will be no night there.

People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations.

But nothing unclean will enter it,

nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

The Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking,

'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews?

For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.'

When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him;

and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people,

he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born.

They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'"

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men

and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared.

Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying,

'Go and search diligently for the child;

and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.'

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was.

When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy.

On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother;

and they knelt down and paid him homage.

Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod,

they left for their own country by another road.

St. Thomas Becket - Feast Day: December 29



Each year, only four days after celebrating the birth of Christ, the Church commemorates St. Thomas Becket, the Archbishop of Canterbury who was martyred on December 29, 1170. His story stands as one of the most dramatic and courageous examples of Christian fidelity in the face of political pressure. Though his life unfolded nearly nine centuries ago, his witness continues to speak powerfully to the modern believer about conscience, courage, and the cost of discipleship.

Thomas Becket was born in London in 1118 to a middle-class family of French origin. Gifted with intelligence and charm, he advanced quickly in education and public life. His abilities caught the attention of King Henry II of England, who appointed Thomas as his chancellor. The two became close friends. Thomas was loyal, skilled, and politically savvy, making him one of the most influential men in the kingdom. No one at the time could have predicted that their friendship would one day lead to one of the most famous martyrdoms in Christian history.

When the Archbishop of Canterbury died in 1161, King Henry saw an opportunity. He wanted an ally in the Church who would support royal authority and help him consolidate power. Believing Thomas would be that ally, Henry appointed him to the role. Thomas accepted—reluctantly at first—but soon after his ordination and consecration, a profound personal transformation occurred. He embraced the responsibilities of his new office with deep seriousness, turning his focus to prayer, penance, and the spiritual wellbeing of the Church.

This conversion shocked the court and strained his friendship with the king. Henry expected the same compliant chancellor he had once known, but instead found a shepherd determined to defend the independence of the Church. Conflict quickly followed. Henry issued laws that attempted to place clergy under royal courts and limit the Church's freedom. Thomas, compelled by conscience, refused to sign them. What began as tension soon flared into open opposition.

Facing threats and accusations, Thomas fled into exile for several years. During this time, he prayed, wrote letters of encouragement to the faithful, and sought reconciliation. Although he longed for peace, he would not betray the Church's rights. Eventually, a fragile agreement allowed him to return to England. Crowds greeted him with joy, hopeful that the conflict had ended.

But the peace was short-lived. New disputes arose, and Henry—frustrated and angry—uttered words that his knights interpreted as a command. On December 29, 1170, four knights entered Canterbury Cathedral as evening prayers were beginning. They confronted Thomas, demanding that he submit to the king. Thomas refused. Moments later, he was struck down at the altar, giving his life for the freedom of the Church.

His martyrdom shocked Christendom. Almost immediately, miracles were reported at his tomb, and devotion to him spread across Europe. In 1173, only three years after his death, Thomas was canonized a saint. His shrine in Canterbury became one of the most famous pilgrimage sites of the Middle Ages, immortalized in literature such as Chaucer's Canterbury Tales.

St. Thomas Becket challenges us to reflect on our own fidelity to Christ. While most of us will not face violent persecution, we often face pressures—social, political, or personal—that tempt us to compromise our faith. Thomas reminds us that discipleship sometimes requires difficult choices, moral clarity, and the courage to stand firm in the truth.

As we honor his feast on December 29, may we be strengthened by his example and encouraged to follow Christ with integrity, even when it demands sacrifice. St. Thomas Becket, pray for us




