August and September 2022

Two months ago, as I wrote the last newsletter, I commented on the afternoon brief yet heavy shower that I had witnessed a few hours earlier and how the world outside the office window had gotten much greener. I believe that was the last heavy rain we've had. There have been some very light daytime showers and a number at night but it is looking pretty brown around here.

As a result of the warm and dry weather, there have been many days during which it has been possible to work outside. Several people, both professional and volunteer, have done just that and a hand-ful of projects have been worked on or completed around Kewadin United Methodist Church since the end of May. We were finally able to hire contractors to take down the old siding and replace it with vinyl. It was quite a project and the workers were here for about two and a half weeks. Because the sanctuary is one hundred-and twenty-five years old things are not as square as they might be and many of the pieces of siding had to be cut and fitted individually. There were a number of other bumps along the way but they did a wonderful job. The sanctuary was finished when the scene of the rising sun above the stained glass windows was painted twice by members of our congregation and the lighting on the cross and flame which looks beautiful in the evening as you drive past, was replaced. The blacktop of our parking lot was recoated to fill in cracks and slow its deterioration. It was also restriped and is looking much better. The building has also been sprayed outside for bugs.

There were several people from our church family who volunteered to paint the remaining portions of the church. Everyone who volunteered had done a lot of painting so it went quickly. It began with a thorough power wash. Areas to be painted were prepped: rotten boards were replaced and the new boards prepared, scraping was completed, an undercoat was done where needed and windows were readied. The painting itself went pretty quick as large rollers and paint make to cover cinder block was used. There is a little more that needs to be done and also some caulking—all of which will be done in a couple of weeks. Screens have been painted. The front sign posts were repainted and are looking much better. Some sun flowers have been planted. Many weeds and tree branches have been pulled or cut especially on the east side of the church. Everything looks beautiful. God's house should be a testimony to the community that we as his children care. A huge THANK-YOU to everyone who has worked so hard these past two months. We hope to build a little patio between the sanctuary and fellowship hall and will be doing some landscaping and work on our grass later this summer.

There is going to be a concert in our sanctuary on August 21st at 5 p. m. It features our pianist Naomi Spann and her brother Christopher as singers and Marty Sage and Rachel Stratton on the guitar and piano. They are from the Elk Rapids Presbyterian Church. The program will feature a variety of music—Broadway, Christian, and Opera. Finger-food will be available after the concert; and all proceeds from a free-will offering will go to Women's Resource Center and ACTS. Music from the Heart! Hope to see you there!
