We are off to an excellent start and have been the host location for at least twelve different area events some of them new since June 1<sup>st</sup>. It is our hope that we can continue in this direction.

We have made some tremendous changes in the appearance of our church in the last few years as we have sought to have more curb appeal for the many people who pass our church every day (thousands in the summer). Our church family has put in many hours on the gardens and lawn to make them more pleasing to the eye. It has been the decision of the Administrative Board to install an underground sprinkling system. It is currently in the works. It is a welcomed addition.

Also, through the generosity of a donor, Kewadin Community Church has the necessary funding to put our church bell on the portico complete with housing, a striker and a steeple. Most of the work will be done locally so we hope to have it up and ringing in the not-too-distant future. It will be quite a task since the bell weighs 550 pounds, but the portico was constructed to accommodate the bell so it full steam ahead. It will be wonderful to hear it ring again after six years.

On a sad note, Beth Barnes, the steadfast anchor at KCC has purchased a home in Linden, MI a short distance from her son, daughter-in-law and grandson. She will be very much missed by all of us. She has faithfully done the Lord's work for our church family and also Elk Rapids and Williamsburg United Methodist Churches for over fifteen years. She is not sure as to when she will be leaving. It will be a smooth transition.


