I am writing this on Thanksgiving Day morning, looking forward to a nice dinner with my Aunt Dorothy—just the two of us this year. After reviewing the last few newsletters for December and January, I can say after the craziness of the last few years this has been the most normal year we have had recently. Thankfully we have been able to have services each Sunday—mask optional. We have also made major changes in our appearance—most of them outside with the lawn and landscaping. We continue to try to enhance our curb appeal. We have been blessed that many members of our church family have pitched in and helped. We added a community dinner this year after having had only one in the past three years. 


