This is the second year in a row that we have had a "Live vs. Recorded" Event in recent years.

Prior to the performances, Philip Chance, Recording Engineer for the Seattle Wind Symphony, gave a brief description and background for the microphone set-up which consisted of three "minimalist" Neumann microphone configurations on

the one stand; Spaced Pair (Neumann TLM50s), Near-Coincident, and Coincident (stereo mic).

Two artists performed. First up was Violin Soloist Marie' Rossano with her Piano Accompanist Tania Rivers-Moore played pieces by Beethoven and Fritz Kreisler. And then Seattle Opera Soprano Kim

Giordano and her Piano Accompanist Glenda Williams played pieces by Puccini and Gershwin.

Following the performances the artists were given flowers with a rousing standing ovation. Followed by questions by the audience and fascinating information from the performers.


