Discussion Ten: Retrospective

Discussion Scenario:

Using the Agile methodology in software development, at the end of each "sprint" where within a fixed time duration a body of work has been completed, the team has a "retrospective." Thinking back on the week's discussions in the Letter of James:


- Think back on this series of discussions we've shared. Possibly this study provided a lens through
