Discussion Eight: Genuine in Confidence, James 4:13 – 5:12.

Key Phrase: "... You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Instead, you ought to say, 'If it is the Lord's will, we will live and do this or that." James 4:14-15

1. Discussion Scenario:


3. Digging in:

 - 4. What is it that can provide us with absolute confidence in our future?
