# **Challenge 5 - Your Energy Source for Purpose**

# **Challenge Scenario:**

When we want to better visualize or conceptualize something we typically create a model. Whether it's a logical, physical, or mathematical model, it is meant to help us to understand, define, quantify and predict or simulate behavior. By referring to a model we can better examine, evaluate and discuss the object or concept with others. In our faith life, we too need models to help us examine and evaluate what a life lived out in faith looks like.
