# A **#Hack4Faith** Discussion-based Study for Groups and/or Individual Enrichment The Letter of James

Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete lacking nothing." James 1:4"

Discussion Seven: Genuine in Relationships, James 4:1-12.

Key Phrase: "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up." James 4:10

#### 1. Discussion Scenario:

a. Someone once quipped, "If I didn't have to deal with people life would be great!" Well, life is made up of dealing with others – and some of the most trying are those closest to us. But not only do we have the "horizontal" relationship with people, we have a "vertical" relationship with God to be considered. The focus on one axis over the other has a direct impact on the other – which relationship we prioritize is our moment-by-moment challenge.

## 2. Right relationships:

a. Read James 4:1-12, <u>James 4:1-12 NIV - Submit Yourselves to God - What causes - Bible Gateway.</u>

## 3. Digging in:

- a. Verses 1-3:
  - i. List all the words that "pop-out" to you in this passage.
  - ii. What "cause and effects" do you see James communicating here?
- b. Verses 4-6:
  - i. What do you identify as the problem in these verses?
  - ii. What does James propose as the solution?
- c. Verses 7-10:
  - The principle of "Submission and Resistance" provides the one-two punch in defeating the enemy. First, let's look at the premier example for this principle in action. Read Matthew 4:1-11 <u>Matthew 4:1-11 NIV - Jesus Is Tested in the Wilderness - Bible Gateway</u>.
    - 1. From Jesus' example in these Matthew 4 verses, what practical guidance/steps do you see for defeating temptation?
    - 2. James calls out "submission **and** resistance." Do you see a weakness if we are to only do one without the other?
    - 3. List any questions you'd like to discuss with the group.
