Presidents' Message

Coaching young pre-teen and then teen -age girls says a lot about the kind of man Mike was. Just think about that: Coaching teen-age girls!

Angel is now married to Sean, and blessed Mike and Alma with 5 grandchildren, Austin, Colby, Travis, Holly and Benny. During Mike's illness, Angel was his ears and sometimes his voice at doctor appointments and hospital stays. In fact, at one such hospital stay, Angel was asking too many questions which made Mike uncomfortable so he called for Security!

Mike Jr is married to Marcie and they also blessed Mike and Alma with 4 grandchildren, KC, Megan, Machaela and Maddie. Mike Jr said that his Dad was his "go to" person. Mike and his Dad always had each other's back. Mike Jr remembers hunting trips with his dad, and working on cars. They always seem to have a project to work on. One such project was a VW Baja Dune Buggy. While out in the Dune Buggy they had an experience with a weird rabbit. For some reason this rabbit was hopping alongside the Dune buggy and then all of a sudden decided to get in front of the Buggy. Sadly, the rabbit was hit, and Mike looked at Jr and said "Kwazy Rabbit", and Jr replied, "Trix are for Kids!"

Mike worked as a Parts man at El Camino Auto, where he met a life-long friend and mentor, Bill Gainey. He then worked at Williams & Lane in Berkely, and his met his lifelong friend Keith Knox. Mike and Alma visited Keith and his family in Napa one day. They then went back to Pacifica, sold their home and moved to Napa. Mike eventually retired in 2016 after working for 46 years for Generator Rental Services, which supplied industrial generators to businesses all over the north bay. Mike was a highly respected and sought-after individual in his field.

In addition to coaching Napa Girls Junior Softball League, Napa Valley Express, Napa Valley College Softball, Mike was involved with his Church, Grace Church of Napa Valley, and the Napa Elks Lodge. Mike found his second family, the Napa Valley Cruisers Car Club. Mike has been the President of the Cruisers for the last seven years, and spent many more years in different board positions. Mike was also in charge of the annual Car show, Main Street Reunion, held each August in downtown Napa.

Mike loved to hunt and camp. Mike Jr and Sandy both remember deer and pheasant hunting. The hunting trips were more about spending time together then hunting. If they got a deer or came home with pheasants that was a bonus.

Mike also loved cars. He liked to fix them up, and he loved to Cruise in them. At one time Mike had a 1959 Chevy Apache Truck. A beautiful blue truck. Mike Jr. remembers going to Benicia, with his dad in this truck. They were in a parking lot and for some reason Mike got in the truck and started doing donuts in the lot. Mike Jr said he just kept doing donuts, and he thought "what in the world?" Then Mike's door on his truck swung open. Mike slowed down and shut his door, he then parked the truck where Mike Jr was standing, got out of the truck and said "Yeah, I meant to do that".

Last August Mike made a final trip home to Centerville, Iowa. This was a trip of a lifetime. Mike got the chance to show Angel and Mike Jr where he was born, where he played, where he went to school, the houses he lived in and those of his friends. I remember Mike talking in detail about all the family he saw. Family came from all over to see Mike. He was overjoyed. He also talked in great detail about the Pork Tenderloin sandwiches and all of the variety of pies. You could see joy and peace come over Mike, when he spoke of this trip. I believe this trip gave Mike some renewed energy.

This past April Mike attended Kool April Nights in Redding. In Alma's Impala they cruised to Redding, along with many members of the Napa Valley Cruisers. Angel made the trip with her son Austin, and his brother Sandy came up with his family. It was a special weekend. Mike had his scooter, and was buzzing around and honking his horn for people to move out of his way, as he had a lot of cars to look at, and knew his time was short. That weekend his brother, Sandy brought out a truck he had been working on. It was a 1972, Chevy that was once Mike's truck. In fact it was the truck that Angel and Mike Jr learned to drive in. Mike was very proud of the work his brother Sandy put into the Truck. Sandy honored Mike, as the license plate reads: My Bro 72.

Mike is going to be deeply missed. He was thoughtful, caring and wise. He had integrity. Like Sandy said, he never gave you the answers, but guided you. I am going to miss our hello hugs, and our goodbye hugs. As you received the goodbye hug, he would whisper "I love you". One of our Cruiser friends posted on Facebook: "Mike got into his heavenly hot rod and left the earth".

I don't know if Mike would have approved of this long eulogy. He wouldn't have wanted all the attention on him, as he was humble. I saw this John Wayne quote, and I can just hear Mike saying this to me: "Chris, you're short on ears and long on mouth"


