Tournament Contact Information:

Tournament headquarters will be at Grapevine High School all weekend. The most efficient source of up-to-date information can be found on the Exposure Basketball Website under the TBC Summer State Tournament event. Tournament Registration Information:

Team entry fee is \$375.00 for a minimum of 5 games. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is required from all teams to hold your spot. The entry fee must be received by June 13th.

Team Check-in Information:

Teams will check-in Friday the 13th at Heritage Middle School before their first game. Check-in will begin at 8AM on Friday.

The team's coach or a representative can complete the check-in process (players <u>do not</u> have to be present for check-in).

Check-in process is considered "complete" when the following have been received and verified:

- Registration fee
- Team Roster form
- Player Waiver forms

Tournament Game Schedule:

Due to the number of teams attending the state tournament, <u>schedule requests will not be</u> <u>guaranteed.</u> All teams will play pool-play games Friday and Saturday. Bracket play will begin and end on Sunday. All teams will play all 3-days (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday).

Tournament Team Eligibility Rules:

Any private or public high school in Texas is eligible to participate (charter schools are not considered private schools, so if they are not a member of the UIL they cannot qualify for the state tournament).

ALL team members must live in the attendance zone for the same high school (NO SELECT TEAMS), and private school players must currently be enrolled at that high school or feeder school.

All participants must have at least one-year of high school eligibility remaining
No out-of-state teams will be eligible to compete in the State Tournament
All teams must have an adult sitting on the bench for games (or head coach in attendance).

State Tournament Game Rules:

Games will be two 18-minute running clock halves:

*Clock will stop final 30-seconds of 1st half and final 2 minutes of 2nd half

*Clock will not stop in 2nd half if a team is winning by 20+ points

Each team receives 2-timeouts

Each player will get 6 personal fouls

*If a player receives 2 technical fouls in the same game, they have to sit out the next game as well Double-bonus will be on 8th team foul in each half

Free-throws will be 1 for 2/3 points in running-clock situations but will be regulation during stopped-clock situations.

3-Minute Half-time

Over-time is: 45 seconds (you will play this format till there is a winner)

Team must have at least 5 players at game-time to begin. A team must forfeit if they don't have at least 5 players 5 minutes after the game was scheduled to start.



State Tournament Pool Play:

The field of teams will be divided into pools, to determine seeding for bracket play. But all teams will have the opportunity to advance in the bracket to win the Summer State Championship.

State Tournament Pool Play Tie-Breakers:

If 2 teams have the same record at the end of pool play, the first tie-breaker is head-to-head, followed by pool play differential, and if necessary total points scored.

If 3 or more teams are tied at the end of pool play, the first tie-breaker is point-differential involving the games versus the tied teams, followed by total points scored (*if necessary*). Once a winner has been determined, the remaining 2 teams will follow the 2-way tie-breaker format.

State Tournament Admission Information:

Each team will be issued no more than 2 wrist-bands for the coaches sitting on the bench with the team at check-in (*high school coaches receive their bands with a TABC, THSCA, TGCA, or some other coaching association pass*). This wrist-band must be worn on the wrist every day. Any coach not wearing their wrist-band will be required to pay admission (<u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>). If a coach loses their wristband, they will be required to purchase a replacement band. Players will be admitted if they are wearing a team jersey.

State Tournament Admission fees:

<u>Adults</u>

Daily Admission: \$15 each day

Tournament Pass: \$35.00 (covers all games at all game-sites for entire tournament)

Youth/Senior Citizens (ages 6-18 and 65+)

Daily Admission: \$12 each day

Tournament Pass: \$30.00 (covers all games at all game-sites for entire tournament)

Age 5 and under: FREE ADMISSION

All TABC, THSCA, and TGCA passes will be accepted

<u>Please Note</u>: If you purchase a tournament pass and lose the wrist-band, you will be required to pay admission. Gate-workers will not admit any person without a tournament or a daily admission wrist-band. <u>Finally, wrist-bands must be worn on the wrist only</u>.



Hotel Information for Traveling Teams:

We have a block of rooms reserved at Fairfield Inn (Fairfield Inn & Suites Dallas DFW Airport North/Coppell Grapevine for 149.00 USD per night with a 2-Night minimum). So, teams may also shop around for the best deal they can find. Look in the Euless area (near 121), Grapevine, Coppell, Southlake, and even west Irving.

State Tournament Awards:

Championship t-shirts and medals will be awarded to the 1^{st} place finisher in each division. Medals will also be awarded to the 2^{nd} place team in each division.

Tournament Withdrawal Policy:

A team withdrawing from a tournament creates numerous issues and needs to be avoided if possible. This withdrawal policy is in place to compensate Texas Basketball Championships for having to scramble last-minute to change workers, officials, and game schedules.

- For any team withdrawing before June 6th, a fee of \$50 will be charged and the balance will be returned to the team.
- For any team withdrawing on or after June 6^{th} , there could potentially be no money refunded to the team.
