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Hiram A. Switzer

The first Crawford County record of Hiram A. Switzer is in the Census of 1910. He is listed as living in Ohio Township, age 68, a farmer, father born in PA and mother born in Ohio. His wife was listed as Mary C., age 68. He also had a female in the family, listed as Viola Hart, age 30, who in the 1900 Census taken in Lagro, Wabash County, Indiana was listed as "adopted daughter" and her name was Viola Pugh, born February, 1880. In the 1910 Census, Viola had a daughter, named Helen I. Hart, age 8.

Other families listed on the 1910 Ohio Township Census page were: W.W. Jones, John M. Dillman, Emery Sturgeon, M.M. Smith and Frank Wright.

In the 1920 Crawford, Ohio Twp. Census, Hiram Switzer was listed, but apparently Mary C. had passed away. In addition to Hiram was Ola "Viola" Hart and Helen I. Hart, age 18.

Other families listed near the Hiram Switzer family in 1920 were: David Hedden, Rudolph Parker, Edgar McConnell, David Byrd, Logan Wiseman, James Austin, W.W. Jones, Harvin Tot-

ten and John Linton.

Helen I. Hart married Alva Luther ODOM in 1921 according to the Crawford Marriage Index (record in Book L, page 203).

Hiram Switzer is last listed in the 1930 Census of Crawford as living in Sterling Twp, English, Indiana. Also in the household was Viola E. Hart, age 50.

The Crawford Co. Death Index lists a Hiram J. Switzer as dying March 25, 1934, but I find no listing in the Cemetery Index as to where he was buried.

Years ago, and sometimes even today, I have heard reference made to "Switzer's Corner." This was apparently a store that stood at the intersection of two crossroads between the villages of Riddle and Curby.

49th Indiana Biographies

OLIVER WHITCOMB was born on September 15, 1831, Scio, Allegany, New York. He was the son of William Whitcomb, born March 14, 1796, in Henniker, New Hampshire, and Johannah Tilton, born in Greenwich, Artleypool, England.

Oliver and Ellen were married October 1, 1856 in Ogdensburg, St. Lawrence, Pennsylvania. Oliver moved to Leavenworth, Indiana sometime before 1860 as his first child Oliver Norton Whitcomb was born there on August 19, 1860. In November 21, 1861, he mustered into the War of the Rebellion in Jeffersonville, Indiana, and joined the 49th Indiana Volunteer Infantry, Company F. When he mustered in he was a Sergeant, on March 23, 1863 he was promoted to second Lieutenant. He fought at Cumberland Gap, Chickasaw Bayou, Arkansas Post, Young's Point and the Vicksburg campaign. His daughter-in-law, Nellie Gilmore Whitcomb describes the following: "Old Grandpa Whitcomb, Oliver, was a Lieutenant in the Civil War and fought at Vicksburg. Oliver was wounded there, where he lay on the battlefield all day. A bomb burst on his chest and collapsed one lung. A little Negro boy, that Oliver and Capt. Hollcroft (Company H) picked up in New Orleans, crawled out to the wounded Oliver, onto the battlefield, and gave him a drink of water out of his canteen. The Negro boy then went back and told them where Oliver was. Oliver came home and got well and went back to the war and stayed until the end. The Negro boy and I worshiped father Oliver,

he was the best old man I ever knew." Oliver remained in the war until he mustered out November 29, 1864. Oliver and Ellen had five more children after the War. Oliver's occupations were brick layer, undertaker and owned a general store. He continued his general store until he became ill and his son, William France Whitcomb (France), took over the business. Oliver died March 29, 1914, Leavenworth, Indiana. Oliver and his wife, Ellen Whitcomb, are buried in the Cedar Hill Cemetery in Leavenworth, Indiana.

On page 141 of A History of Crawford County, by H. H. Pleasant, recently edited and reprinted by L.M. Burmeister, is a reference to Hiram Switzer. He evidently ran as Commissioner in his district (third) in 1906 where he was beaten by 166 votes by Jerry Russell, Democrat.

Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society Minutes for the November Meeting.

The Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society met on November 9, 2009 in the media center of the Crawford County Jr-Sr High School with President Densil Wilson presiding.

All veterans who were present were acknowledged.

Becky Stetter read a poem, A Prayer For Our Soldiers, and passed around a brochure from the Indiana War Museum in Indianapolis that she and Roberta Toby recently visited.

Richard Eastridge, County Historian, gave a brief history of the Sulphur Springs Hotel that was located at Sulphur, Indiana.

President Wilson recessed the meeting for 15 minute committee meetings.

After reconvening the meeting, President Wilson explained the committees responsibilities which are: Each committee is to take minutes of each of their meetings and make their own decisions.

The **minutes** were read by Priscilla Eastridge. Evelyn Jackson asked about the obituaries that were donated by Mack Tucker. The Augst 8, 2005 minutes stated that they were to be kept at the archives, they are at the home of Richard Eastridge at this time. This should be corrected, that these files were not obituaries, but were card files with death dates and marriages. They were not donated by Mack Tucker. Mr. Tucker had given these files to an individual who in turn, gave them to another individual, who later gave them to Richard Eastridge.

Sharon Morris gave the **Treasurer's Report**. The beginning balance as of October 13, 2009 was \$17,899.79, deposits \$438.30 and disbursements \$87.00. Ending balance as of November 9, 2009 \$18,251.09. Jeff Mitchell has not yet been paid for the repairs of the



Riceville Depot but will be included in next month's report.

President Densil Wilson told the society that all monies belong to the society even though we have two separate accounts.

Evelyn Jackson read the **Proctor House** financial report. The beginning balance October 13, 2009 was \$8,409.80, disbursements were \$58.42, leaving an ending balance as of Nov. 10, 2009 of \$8,351.38. Evelyn also announced that Bob Wiseman, Hugh Jackson and Glen Toby have cleaned out the building and winterized the house. There was a discussion on what color to paint the depot and what name to put on it. Jim Kaiser suggested that the Proctor House Committee make that decision.

Jim Kaiser asked about the status of the **Historical Register** and if the Community Foundation Grant Committee had been informed of the house being painted using the grant from them. Evelyn Jackson has sent them that information.

Betsy Young, Chairman of the **Fund Raising Committee**, gave a report of the ornaments that were sold at the Sorghum Festival. There were 22 ornaments sold at \$5 each and a booth fee of 10% of sales, which left a balance of \$99.00 in sales. Seven other ornaments were sold at \$8 each for a total of \$56. The final total of ornaments sold was \$155.00.

Motion was made by Priscilla Eastridge to change the price of the ornaments to \$5. The motion was seconded by Betsy Young. Motion carried. President Wilson put it to a vote and the outcome was 13 for and 4 against.

Besty Young resigned from making of the ornaments.

Larry Burmeister stated that the Probate Book has been transcribed by Roberta Toby, but it is too large to print for sale.

Priscilla Eastridge reported that we presently have **82 paid members**.

Scrapbook Committee: Robin Piper said it is going well.

Web Site Report: Bill Piper has added several veterans to the site. These were submitted by Roberta Toby and Becky Stetter.

Newsletter Report: The end of the year newsletter will be mailed by the first of December. Larry Burmeister presented a printing bill of \$77.25. Motion made by Sandra Wilson and seconded by Betsy Young to pay the bill. Motion carried.

Jr. Membership Report: Roberta Toby gave the report. Jim Kaiser made a motion for her and Becky Stetter to talk to the Superintendent of the Crawford County Schools to explore the possibilities of help from the school on this project. Motion seconded by Larry Burmeister. Motion carried. Maxine Redding made a motion for an amendment to the motion to ask the superintendent to do a survey to see if students would be interested. Jim Kaiser seconded it and the motion carried.

Archives: Closed for the winter.

Vice-President Report: Nothing to report.

Historian Report: Richard Eastridge said he is planning to place a stone for an African-American who was killed on the railroad in 1885 and was buried outside the
