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Evelyn Jackson Receives Willard C. Heiss Family History Award

INDIANAPOLIS—The Indiana Historical Society presented its 2010 Willard C. Heiss Family History / Genealogy Award to Evelyn Harper Jackson of Depauw, Ind., at its annual Founders Day Dinner on Dec. 6, 2010. The presentation took place at the Eugene and Marilyn Glick Indiana History Center, located at 450 W. Ohio St. in downtown Indianapolis.

The Willard C. Heiss Family History/Genealogy Award is made annually to a family historian for his or her distinguished service and career in Indiana family history including presentation such as articles in The Hoosier Genealogist: Connections, use of materials and preservation.

Jackson has donated thousands of hours toward a variety of patriotic organizations and efforts. One of her key accomplishments has been the collection of facts on area soldiers who served during the War of 1812. She has completed more than 900 soldier forms, which include service information, place of burial and genealogical/family details. She has been the motivating force behind the replacement of numerous gravestones that were unreadable, broken or totally missing.

Whether assisting the manager of the Crawford County Public Library's Genealogy Department, securing one of the

area's many historical markers, or working on the Proctor House Restoration Project, Jackson's knowledge and reputation is widely respected. She has and continues to serve in many capacities for both the Hoosier Elm Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Jonathan Jennings Chapter of the Daughters of the War of 1812.

Recent awards received by Jackson include the National Martha Washington Medal and Award Certificate, given in recognition of service to the Sons of the American Revolution, as well as the "Spirit of Generosity" award, which she and her husband, Hugh, received from the Community Foundation of Crawford County.

Since 1830, the Indiana Historical Society has been Indiana's Storyteller, connecting people to the past by collecting, preserving,

interpreting and sharing the state's history.

Note: Evelyn, along with husband, Hugh Jackson, has been a vital part of the Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society. They were instrumental in obtaining the Proctor House for the society and they are active in the maintenance and upkeep of the property. We, the members of the society are very proud of Evelyn and Hugh and are thankful they are a part of our organization!

December 2010 Meeting of the Society was cancelled because of the weather.

January 2011 Minutes.

The January meeting of the Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society was held on January 10, 2011 at the Crawford County Library.

The meeting opened with a moment of silence and the Pledge to the Flag.

No speaker was scheduled for the January meeting.

Since the December meeting, which was supposed to be the Christmas Party, had to be cancelled, there were no minutes for the month of December, 2010.

Sharon Morris submitted her Treasurer's report to Larry Burmeister as she was unable to attend.

The beginning balance as of November 8, 2010 was \$13, 312.08. After deposits from dues and books and the disbursements of checks the balance as of January 10, 1011 is \$13,229.59.

President Larry Burmeister received correspondence from Peggy Brooks stating that she had sent her report in to Indiana State Landmarks and the Indiana State Preservation Office on December 31 2010. As of Monday nights meeting Larry has had no response from them. She is requesting \$500.00 in payment for her work with ½ to be paid after her application is received in Indianapolis and the other ½ after the application is received and accepted.

Since there has been no word

received yet on the application Evelyn Jackson suggested that Larry Burmeister contact Greg Sekula to check on it.

Vice President, Roberta Toby reported that the Craft Show at the 4-H Fairgrounds was a success as in regard to ornament sales.

Jim Kaiser asked about the meeting with the County Council for the \$5,000.00 donation to the Society.

Evelyn Jackson gave the Proctor House Report. She reported that they had received a check from the County Council and that we might possibly be eligible to receive this amount each year.

The Proctor House beginning balance was \$8,256.95 plus the \$5,000.00 check from the Council and ornament sales and money received from building material returns made total of \$13,994.82, minus expenditures for Labor, building supplies, ornament blanks and Duke Energy left a balance of \$2,083.25. The report was accepted as read.

Jim Kaiser asked who was in charge of making the ornaments and what kind of record was kept on them.

Roberta Toby stated that since the Archives are closed for the winter she had received no funds. Larry Burmeister said he had received \$35.00 for research which he had deposited. An inventory has been taken of all items at the Archives that belong to the Crawford County Historical and Genealogical Society.

Marie Greathouse asked if the Society needed paper cutters, etc. and said she was also helping to locate file cabinets for the Society.

Helena Burmeister, publications reported sales of \$304.00 deposited, with \$35.54 due for shipping and printing of books sold. The report was accepted as read.

Bill Piper, website, has added a new link and photo to the website and updated the ornaments order form.

Evelyn Jackson spoke about her recent award. (See Page 2) The Indiana Historical Society presented it's 2010 Willard C. Heiss Family History/Genealogy award to Evelyn Harper Jackson at its Annual Founders Day Dinner on Dec. 6, 2010. She said that several people sent in letters nominating her for the award and she thanked Larry and Helena Burmeister for taking her and Hugh to Indianapolis to attend the award ceremony.

Larry Burmeister sent in the nomination for Richard Eastridge as County Historian. He has not received any info on the nomination yet.

Evelyn Jackson stated that she has finally located where former Crawford countian, Sampson Turley in buried in Harrison County.

Marie Greathouse announced that the Homestead Awards will be given out this year. Farm has to be at least 20 acres and in the same family for 100 or more years.

Jim Kaiser announced that he and Doris will have open house on Sat. Feb. 12, 2011 at the Senior Citizens Center to celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary from 2-4 o'clock.

Bill Piper suggested a Civil War Theme. It was decided to go with this theme. Evelyn Jackson. Rebecca Hammond Stetter, Marie Greathouse, Helena Burmeister Roberta Toby are on the committee for this event. The menu for the event should be based on the 1860's theme. The Establishment Day Celebration will be March 1, 2011 at the Senior Citizens Building. Meal will be at 6:00 p.m.

Evelyn Jackson is in charge of the speaker for this meeting.

Rebecca Hammond Stetter made the motion to adjourn the meeting and Larry Burmeister seconded. The meeting adjourned at 7:57 p.m.
