Born Aug. 20, 1943, in Crawford County, he was the son of the late Desco Eastridge and Irene Kirchoff.

He earned a master's degree from Ball State University, was a retired teacher from Crawford County Junior-Senior High School after 36 years, was a recipient of the Sagamore of the Wabash, served many years as the Crawford County historian, was honored by the Indiana Historical Society, was a published author for his writings about Crawford County history, was a founding member of the Crawford County Historical and Genealogical Society and was a member the Crawford County library board, Taswell Christian Church and Masonic Lodge 709 in Eckerty.

Survivors include his wife, the former Priscilla Huff; two children, Mary Jo Allen and Jason Eastridge, both of Taswell; a brother, Randall Eastridge; eight grandchildren; and two greatgrandchildren.

The Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society expresses their sympathy and condolences to the Richard Eastridge family

for their loss. Richard was widely recognized as a leading historian for his knowledge of Crawford County history and genealogy.

Richard is a descendent of early pioneer settlers of Crawford County. He developed a deep appreciation of local history early in life listening to oral history from grandparents and other individuals of the community.

Richard led the effort in 1974 to reactivate the Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society. Through his leadership, the society has continued to be a significant player in the preservation and education of local history. Richard lead in the research of the history of the pre-Civil War Proctor House in Marengo given to the Society in 2006. It will soon be on the National Register of Historical Places.

Richard was appointed "Crawford County Historian" by the Indiana Historical Society in 1995 and has continued to serve our county in that voluntary capacity. Richard was also a member of the local society and chair of its Research and Publications Committee. Richard has published or re-published over 20 books on Crawford County historical topics.

Following his retirement from teaching in 1998, he has voluntarily worked nearly full time on local history and genealogy. Descendents from Crawford County families who live in other states constantly communicate with Richard to learn of their roots and history in Crawford County. Many times Richard may spend a day or more with individuals with roots in Crawford County touring significant places of interest and discussing local history.

Richard's professional career of teaching in Crawford County afforded him the opportunity to stay in the county and to acquire many historical artifacts, collect local family folk lore; and legal documents offered at public auction that would likely have left the local area.

Richard has received honors from the Indiana Historical Society by receiving its 2004 Hubert Hawkins History Award for his work on local history. In 2005, Richard received the prestige of being named an Indiana Sagamore of the Wabash, an award given by the Governor of Indiana for his volunteer service. The Patoka Elementary School chose to develop an outdoor classroom facility on adjacent forest land owned by the school corporation.

Richard led in the establishment of a pond near the wooded area, establishment of a native prairie area and a shelter house. He also located a nearby pioneer log cabin and assisted in moving it to the school and restoring it for classroom activities. The log cabin was donated to the school by local descendents of those who originally built it.

When asked where he lived, Richard would sometimes respond by saying, "Patoka Township, the upper end" rather than saying "North of Taswell." This was a typical response made by someone running for political office during the 1930's and 1940's. Patoka Township was divided into two voting precincts, one at Taswell and one at Wickliffe. Around election times, candidates would always greet someone by "how is it in the upper end" or "how is it in the lower end." This meant how my candidate is doing (is he winning or losing). The "upper end" were

The Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society met on May 9, 2011 at the shelter house on the Proctor House property in Marengo. A cookout was held before the meeting in observance of Historic Preservation Month.

The program was presented by Doris Leistner on the Society of Indiana Pioneers. The society was founded in 1916 and is composed of descendants of early Indiana Pioneers. The office is located in the Indiana State Library.

June 2011 Minutes.

The Crawford County Historical & Genealogical Society met on June 13 at the Crawford County Public Library. The meeting was opened with a moment of silence and the pledge to the flag. The program for the month was given by Roberta Toby with information sent by John T. Neville from the Corps of Engineers about Dam #44 in Leavenworth, IN. Plans for the dam were started in 1918 with an estimated cost of \$1,280,000. The project was completed in September of 1926 at a final cost of \$2,891,700.

A short recess was held while various committees held

meetings.

The meeting was then called to Order with the reading of the **minutes** by Secretary Janice Eastridge. After correcting the next meeting to June instead of July the minutes were accepted.

Treasurer Sharon Morris gave the **Treasurer's Report**. The beginning balance on May 10, 2011 was \$8,168.13 with an ending balance of \$8,803.29 on June 13, 2011. The report was accepted as read.

The **President's Report** was given by Larry Burmeister. Several members have been getting signatures for a petition to present to the County Commissioners concerning the possible purchase of the old Dollar Store building. Visits were also made to Richard Eastridge in which he gave some old documents that have now been transcribed into two books, Crawford County School Census, 1917-1919 and the Eckerty Mill.

The Vice-President's Report was given by Roberta Toby. Hugh & Evelyn Jackson and Glen & Roberta Toby worked at the Marengo Alumni Banquet on May 28. Two ornaments, \$60 in books and one membership were sold. Roberta also asked for signatures for the petition and for as many members as possible to attend the Commissioners meeting. The speaker for August will discuss how to repair old books.

Membership at this time stands at about 42 renewals.

The **Proctor House Report** was given by the Wiseman's and Jackson's. Now that the addition has been removed, placement of the door and windows need to be decided. The brick also needs to be tucked and painted where the addition was taken down.

Greg Sekula and Laura Renwick will be at the Proctor Houe

on Thursday at 9 am to discuss grants that are available and to advise on the door and window placement. Laura has agreed to fill-in the additional requirements needed for the historic register. The contents of the shed need to be cleaned out soon, Glen Toby is going to make repairs and paint. Two loads of dirt were brought by Brent Birkla to fill in behind the house. The final cost for the removal of the addition was \$1,750. The estimate was for \$1,500, the difference being for stump removal. No Financial Report was given due to the account being off by \$60. The bank is doing an audit at this time. change has been made concerning the yard sale, instead of donations, a price list will be made for items and larger items will be priced.

Audit Committee Report by Jim Kaiser: He asked that everything pertaining to the audit be turned in by June 18, 2011.

Archives Report by Roberta Toby: A deposit of \$40.25 was made on May 31. The family of Guido & Nadine Hammond donated a two drawer file cabinet. Marie Greathouse donated some historical magazines which are being inventoried and shelved.

Publications Report given by Helena Burmeister: Total amount of deposit since last meeting was \$300 for books and memberships.

Web Site Report given by Bill Piper: There are more Revolutionary War Veterans to be added.

Fundraising Report given by Marie Greathouse: She has received samples from two other publishing companies
