Holy Week opens at St. Mary's with Palm Sunday on April 10. What follows is a total of four services over eight days. This is the most important week in the Christian calendar. Palm Sunday (BCP page 270) commemorates Christ's dramatic entry into Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives down to the Kidron Valley and back up into the ancient city. At. St. Marv's, we'll begin outside and process into the church to the strains of "All Glory Laud and Honor." Our altar guild will have palm fronds and crosses for this important event. We will read the Passion story as a congregation recorded by St. Luke in the third Gospel since we are in Year C of the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL).

Things will quiet down for our church until Thursday, but all during this week (Mon-Fri), the Christian Ministerial Association will be hosting a noon day Holy Week service in the Four Freedoms Park followed by lunch. Take time off from work to join us and set your heart on all that is unfolding according to God's plan.

On Mandy Thursday (BCP page 274) at 5:30, St. Mary's will host its traditional service to commemorate The Last Supper. A foot washing will also be included in context of this Holy Eucharist. We will observe Good Friday (BCP page 276) at the same time (5:30) the following evening. Continued from left....

This is not a Eucharistic celebration. We will read from the Gospel of John who was the only disciple to personally witness these events. We will quietly return to our homes to prepare for Easter and Resurrection Sunday. The somber season of Lent is now officially over as we give praise for God's most important gift to us, the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and a New Covenant.

You can participate in each moment of Holy Week by studying the referenced pages in the prayer book, attending the services in person, or joining us online by Zoom. Bless our church and its missions.


