Core Scripture

- 2 Peter 3:3–4 "Scoffers will come... saying, Where is the promise of His coming?"
- 2 Peter 3:8–9 "The Lord is not slow to fulfill His promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you..."
- 2 Peter 3:10–13 "The day of the Lord will come like a thief..."
- → Read these verses slow.
- → Let them punch holes in your impatience.





Problem #1: People get cocky when judgment doesn't fall immediately.

They mistake **God's patience** for **God's absence** — like fools partying while the dam's cracking.

Problem #2: Christians get sleepy waiting for Jesus to show up.

They drift, doubt, deconstruct — because they don't understand that *delay is mercy*, not weakness.

Problem #3: The world treats God's patience as permission to sin harder.

But Peter says judgment isn't canceled — it's just locked and loaded.



- 1. Have you ever felt like God was "taking too long" in your life?

- 2. Why do you think God waits instead of judging evil immediately?
 - → How does that change your view of "delay"?
