BA Study Guide: Matthew 25-28

Overview

Matthew 25–28 isn't just the ending of a gospel—it's the final warning and marching orders from a resurrected King. Jesus calls out apathy, laziness, fake religion, and fear. Then He conquers death and commands His men to go make disciples.

These chapters aren't about reflection—they're about response.

Chapter Breakdown

Matthew 25 – Be Ready or Be Left Out

• **Parable of the Ten Virgins**: Five wise women kept oil for the bridegroom's arrival. Five didn't.

The door was shut. "I don't know you," He says to the unprepared.

• **Parable of the Talents**: Two servants invest what the Master gave them. One buries it out of fear.

The Master calls him wicked and lazy.

• Sheep and Goats Judgment: Jesus separates the obedient from the indifferent.

"What you did for the least of these, you did for Me."

Key Truth: The King is coming. Readiness = obedience, not enthusiasm.

Challenge: What's the "oil" in your life? What are you investing—or burying?

Matthew 26 – The Road to the Cross

- Jesus is anointed with costly oil—preparing for burial.
- Judas agrees to betray Him.
- The Last Supper: Jesus establishes a new covenant.
- Gethsemane: Jesus sweats blood, submits to the Father, and finds His disciples asleep.
- Jesus is arrested, falsely tried, and denied by Peter.

Key Truth: The battle isn't at the cross—it's in the **garden of surrender**.

Reflection: Where are you spiritually asleep when you should be interceding?

Matthew 27 – The Cost of Obedience

- Jesus stands silent before Pilate.
- The crowd chooses Barabbas.
- Roman soldiers mock and beat Him.
- Jesus is crucified, cries out, and dies.
- The curtain in the temple is torn.
- A centurion declares: "Surely this was the Son of God."

Key Truth: Jesus didn't die as a victim. He died as a victorious, willing substitute.

Action Step: What does your life say about His worth? Is your worship costly?

Matthew 28 – The Risen King & The Great Commission

- The stone is rolled away.
- Jesus defeats death.
- The women are the first to hear the resurrection message.
- Jesus meets His disciples and gives them His final command:

"Go make disciples of all nations..."

Key Truth: We're not called to sit in victory—we're called to move in it.

Commission: Who are you discipling right now? Who are you actively reaching?

God's Character Revealed

- Righteous Judge He separates sheep and goats based on obedience (25)
- **Suffering Servant** Jesus submits to betrayal and crucifixion (26–27)
- Risen King He defeats death and commissions His people (28)
- **Eternal Bridegroom** He returns for a ready church (25)

What This Confronts in Me

- My tendency to **delay obedience** thinking I have more time
- My desire to be safe instead of sacrificial
- My habit of knowing truth but not **doing** it
- My comfort with being a fan instead of a **follower**

Memory Verse

Matthew 28:18-20

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples..."

This is the mission. It's not optional. It's the call on every man of God.

Today's Battle Plan

- Repent of spiritual laziness. Name where you've buried what God gave you.
- **Identify** one person to disciple and initiate the conversation this week.
- **Pray** for courage to act when it's costly—not just when it's convenient.
- Celebrate the resurrection by walking in daily authority and mission.

Evangelism Tip

When someone says, "I think Jesus was a good teacher," respond:

"He predicted His own death and resurrection. If He got that right, He's more than a teacher."

Disciple-Making Tip

Ask the man you're discipling:

"What do you think Jesus is asking you to do that you've been avoiding?" Then help him obey—today.

Practical Man's Tip (So Easy a Caveman Can Do It)

Text someone and say:

"I'm reading the last chapters of Matthew—life-changing stuff. Want to talk about it this week?"

You don't need a platform. You need obedience.

Final Charge

Jesus is alive.

The cross is empty.

The tomb is broken.

The King is crowned.

So the only question is—are you building the kingdom or burying your gift?

This isn't time to spectate.

It's time to serve, speak, lead, bleed, and obey.

Until He returns—be found faithful.
