"Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful." (1 Corinthians 4:2)
Stewardship is one of the most **overlooked but essential** principles in Scripture.

The Bible teaches that everything we have—our time, talents, resources, and even our influence—belongs to God. We are simply managers, not owners.

Let's break it down.

What Is Biblical Stewardship?

The word **stewardship** comes from the Greek **οἰκονόμος (οἰκοποποs)**, meaning "manager" or "overseer."

- A steward does not own what they manage.
- A steward is entrusted with something valuable.
- A steward is responsible to the owner (God).

Psalm 24:1

"The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein."

P Lesson: Stewardship is about faithfully managing what God has given us, for His glory.

Areas of Stewardship

Biblical stewardship is about **more than money**—it includes **everything God entrusts to us.**

- 1. Stewardship of Time
- Ephesians 5:15-16

"Look carefully then how you walk... making the best use of the time, because the days are evil."

- ✓ Time is a non-renewable resource—once spent, it cannot be recovered.
- ✓ We are called to use our time wisely—not just for productivity, but for God's kingdom.
- How we spend our time reveals our priorities.
- 2. Stewardship of Talents & Gifts
- 1 Peter 4:10

"As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

- Every skill, ability, and spiritual gift comes from God (James 1:17).
- Gifts are not meant for self-promotion but for serving others.
- Are you using your talents for God's glory or personal gain?
- 3. Stewardship of Finances & Resources
- Proverbs 3:9

"Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the firstfruits of all your produce."

- Money is a tool, not a treasure.
- God calls us to be generous, avoid debt, and manage resources wisely.
- ✓ Jesus spoke about money more than any other topic—because it reveals the heart (Matthew 6:21).
- Are you controlling your money, or is your money controlling you?
- 4. Stewardship of Influence & Leadership
- **Luke 12:48**

"To whom much is given, of him much will be required."

- ✓ Influence is not about power—it's about responsibility.
- ✓ Leadership should reflect humility, integrity, and service (Mark 10:45).
- ✓ We are accountable for how we lead and impact others.
- True leaders are stewards—not owners—of their influence.
- 5. Stewardship of the Gospel
- 2 Corinthians 5:20

"We are ambassadors for Christ, God making His appeal through us."

- ✓ The Gospel is the greatest treasure we have.
- We are entrusted to share it, defend it, and live it.
- Evangelism and discipleship are acts of stewardship.
- Are you keeping the Gospel to yourself or sharing it faithfully?

The Mindset of a Biblical Steward

- 1. Recognize God Owns Everything
- Deuteronomy 8:18

"You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you power to get wealth."

- ✓ We don't own anything—we manage what belongs to God.
- 2. Be Faithful in Small Things
- **Luke 16:10**

"One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much."

- Stewardship is about character, not just responsibility.
- 3. Seek God's Kingdom First
- Matthew 6:33

"Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

- Stewardship means putting God's priorities ahead of our own.
- ✓ 4. Live Generously
- 2 Corinthians 9:6-7

"God loves a cheerful giver."

True stewards give freely because they trust God as their provider.

Common Misconceptions About Stewardship

- X 1. "Stewardship Is Only About Tithing"
 - Stewardship includes money but also time, gifts, and influence.
- X 2. "God Wants Me to Be Rich"
 - Biblical stewardship is about faithfulness, not financial prosperity.
 - ✓ Wealth is a blessing when used wisely—but a curse when idolized.
- X 3. "I Can Do Whatever I Want with My Life"
 - ✓ We belong to God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).
 - Stewardship means aligning our lives with His will.

The Reward of Faithful Stewardship

Matthew 25:21

"Well done, good and faithful servant."

- Stewardship isn't about obligation—it's about joy.
- God rewards faithfulness with greater responsibility and eternal blessings.
- Living as a steward leads to purpose, peace, and God's blessing.
