

Regeneration

The Miracle of a New Heart

"You must be born again." — Jesus (John 3:7)

What Is Regeneration?

- ❌ **Not a process.**
- ➔ **Justification and sanctification have ongoing aspects, but regeneration is an instantaneous work of God.**
- ❌ **Not based on human effort.**
- ➔ **It is not our decision, prayer, or effort that regenerates us—it is solely the work of the Holy Spirit.**

"So then it depends not on human will or exertion, but on God, who has mercy." (Romans 9:16)

The Fruit of Regeneration

While **we don't cause regeneration**, its effects are unmistakable. When someone is truly born again, they will:

- 🔥 **Hunger for God's Word (1 Peter 2:2)**
- 🔥 **Hate their sin (1 John 3:9)**
- 🔥 **Love Christ and His people (1 John 4:7)**
- 🔥 **Desire obedience (John 14:15)**

Regeneration is not just about **going to heaven**—it's about **being made new on earth**.

How Should Christians Respond?

Regeneration is a **miracle**. It should lead us to:

- 🙌 **Praise God for His sovereign grace.**
- 🛡️ **Preach the Gospel boldly, knowing that God alone gives new life.**
