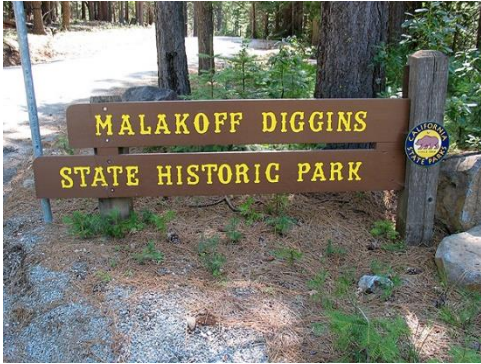


MALAKOFF DIGGINGS STATE HISTORICAL PARK



THIS PARK IS LOCATED IN THE RUGGED, HISTORIC NORTHERN SIERRA NEVAEA GOLD MINING DISTRICT

FEATURES

It is the site of California's largest "hydraulic" mine, featuring huge cliffs carved by mighty streams of water, a result of the gold mining technique of washing away entire mountains to find the precious metal. The park also contains a 7,847-foot bedrock tunnel that served as a drain. The visitor center offers a short video on hydraulic mining and exhibits on life in the old mining town of North Bloomfield.

CAMPING

Camping is available in cabins or in a campground, usually between May and October, depending on snow levels.

Group site	\$165 per night	(Accommodates up to 50 persons)
Family sites	\$ 35 per night	(Accommodates up to 10 persons per site)
Cabins	\$ 40 per night	Day use \$8 per vehicle

LOCATION – In historic Nevada County

Malakoff Diggins is located off Highway 49, approximately 26 miles north of Nevada City (about 2 hours from Sacramento). CAUTION – do not trust your GPS unless you like gravel/dirt roads. Follow the directions given in the sites listed here.
