1. No refund of entry fees will be made.
2. Exhibits will be watched, and every precaution will be taken to protect all the exhibits. In no case will the Cleveland Livestock Show be responsible for loss, damage, theft, breakage, and/or other forms of loss or damage.
3. No one will be allowed to enter the Home Economics Building until after the judging has taken place.
4. Eligibility - Age Classifications will be determined by age on the day of judging

Division	Ages

Junior	8* - 13
PeeWee	4 - 8

**Students must meet the criteria of rule 5 and be a full member of an approved FFA or 4-H group.*

5. Home Economics **Junior and Senior Divisions are open to members of FFA or 4-H Chapters** in Liberty County, that attend one of the listed Liberty County School Districts (Tarkington ISD, Cleveland ISD, Hardin ISD, Liberty ISD, Hull-Daisetta ISD, Devers ISD, home school program or private school and live in one of these school districts and are a Liberty County 4-H member). All school-age participants must be in compliance with their school's current policies concerning participation in extracurricular or other activities. NO PASS NO PLAY.
6. Items or projects entered in Crafts or Fine Arts must have been completed between May and April of the Show year. Not previously exhibited at the Cleveland Livestock Show.
7. **Entry Requirements, Entry Fees & Entry Deadline**
 - o Senior, Junior, PeeWee

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- All entries must be brought to the designated building at the times listed
- 8. Participants may enter only one item in each class.
- 9. The Home Economics Committee has the right to combine classes in the event of an insufficient number of entries in a class, and to create a new class or classes if deemed necessary.
- 10. All decisions of the committee will be **final**.
- 11. **No commercial exhibits** may be entered or displayed.
- 12. All entries should be show-ready at the time of entry. **Nothing will be added after check-in.**
- 13. Specific rules for each division are listed below the classes for that division.
- 14. Entries requiring a recipe will not be accepted at turn-in without the required recipe.

Judging

- **The exhibitor's name will not be displayed during the time of judging**
- All classes will receive a Blue, Red, or White ribbon.
- Rosettes will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champions in each age category and division.
- Youth Auction Grand Champion Sale Items will receive a Belt Buckle & Banner.

Youth Auction

- A. The following Grand Champion Items will be sold during the Youth Auction on Friday. A total of 8 items will be sold at the auction, regardless of the number of Grand Champion Winners.
 - **Food Division** - **2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.**
 - **Craft Division** - **2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.**
 - **Art Division** - **2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.**
 - **Photography Division** - **2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.**
- B. **All exhibitors of the Food Items listed above will be expected to prepare an exact fresh product to present to their respective buyers during the Auction on Friday of show week.**
- C. **A Home Economics representative will notify winning exhibitors.**
- D. Exhibitors are to bring the freshly made food items to the area designated by the Home Economics Chairman by 3 PM on Friday of show week. Auction information will be available from the Home Economics Committee.

Entry Pickup:

- A. **An Entry Tag Receipt is required by anyone, including Exhibitors who pick up entries.**
- B. All Home Economics Food and Non-Food Entries must be picked up at the times listed above, or items will be subject to disposal.

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Food Division (Pee Wee, Junior& Senior)

1. All Food must be exhibited in disposable boxes or Aluminum Pans with lids
2. Exceptions for the Decorated Cakes (Must be Covered in Plastic if the box is not feasible)
3. All Food Must be made from Scratch; no box-enhanced Recipes Accepted
4. Recipe must be displayed on a 3x5 Index Card, without exhibitor's name
5. No Food Entry that requires refrigeration will be allowed
6. Food Items may contain no more than 3 PLASTIC/POLY dowel rods per layer.
 - o NOT to exceed 3 dowels located in each layer.
 - o Recipe cards MUST state how many dowel rods used in each layer.
7. All food items will be cut and tasted by a committee of judges
8. All Entries will be judged on Presentation, Quality, and Flavor
