CONTEST RULES AND GUIDELINES

Entry Deadline –

1. No refund of entry fees will be made.

2. Exhibits will be watched. Every precaution will be taken to protect all the exhibits, but in no case will Cleveland Livestock Show be responsible for loss, damage, theft, breakage and/or other forms of loss or damage. This includes all items left at the designated building during and immediately following the Cleveland Livestock Show.

3. No one will be allowed to enter the Home Economics Building until after the judging has taken place except for Cleveland Livestock Show Home Economics Committee Members. Entries will be processed at the door.

4. **Eligibility** - Age Classification will be determined by age on day of judging

- *Adult – Ages 19+
- Senior Division – Ages 14 -18
- Junior Division – Ages 8- 13
- Peewee Division – Ages 4-8 (not enrolled in 3rd Grade)

**Entries in the Adult Division are limited to nonprofessionals only. Any individuals receiving pay for decorated cakes, pies, etc., are ineligible to participate.*

5. Home Economics Division is open to all residents of Liberty County. All school age participants must be in compliance with their school's current policies concerning participation in extracurricular or other activities. NO PASS-NO PLAY. Junior and Senior Divisions are open to members of FHA, FFA or 4-H Chapters in Liberty County and enrolled in a public elementary, secondary or home school in Liberty County.

6. Items or projects entered in Crafts or Fine arts must have been completed between May and April of the Show year. Not previously exhibited at the Cleveland Livestock Show.

7. **Entry Requirements, Entry Fees & Entry Deadline**

Entry Fees are due on specified date listed above.

- Adult, Senior, Junior, PeeWee - \$5.00 per entry.
- All entries must be brought to the designated building on times listed above.

- Entries will be excepted the day of-with a \$5 entry fee plus \$10 Late fee. (registration form found on website)

9. Participants may enter only one item in each class.

10. The Home Economics Committee has the right to combine classes in the event of an insufficient number of entries in a class, and to create a new class or classes if deemed necessary.

11. All decisions of the committee will be **final**.

12. **No commercial exhibits** may be entered or displayed.

13. All entries should be show ready at time of entry. **Nothing will be added after check-in.**

14. Specific rules for each division are listed below the classes for that division.

15. Entries requiring a recipe will not be accepted without the required recipe.

16. All Home Economics Entries not advancing to youth auction may be for sale according to the schedule set by Home Economics Committee unless otherwise indicated on the entry tag at the time of check –in.

Judging

- **The exhibitor's name will not be displayed during the time of judging**
- All classes will receive blue, red, white or participant ribbon.
- Rosettes will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champion in each age categories and division.
- Youth Auction Grand Champion Sale Items in Food Division will receive a Belt Buckle & Banner.

Youth Auction

A. The following Grand Champion Items will be sold during the Youth Auction Friday. A total of six items will be sold at the auction, regardless of the number of Grand Champion Winners.

Food Division - 2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.
 Cake Division - 2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.
 Craft Division - 2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.
 Art Division - 2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.
 Photography Division - 2 items - 1 Sr. and 1 Jr.

B. **All exhibitors of the Food Items listed above will be expected to prepare an exact fresh product to present to their respective buyers during the Auction on Friday of show week.**

C. A Home Economics representative will notify winning exhibitors on the day of judging. *In the event a winning exhibitor is unable to prepare a fresh item, or chooses not to participate in the Auction. The Reserve Champion winner will have the opportunity to sell his or her item at the Auction. The winning exhibitor is responsible for confirming/declining to sell their auction item to the Livestock Office NO LATER THAN 12:00 noon, Wednesday, of show week.*

D. Exhibitors are to bring the freshly made food item to the area designated by Home Economics Chairman on Friday of show week by 11:00 a.m. Auction info will be available from the Home Economics Committee.

Entry Pickup:

- **An Entry Tag Receipt is required by anyone, including Exhibitor who picks up entries and /or envelopes of awards and /or money.**
- All Home Economic Food and Non Food Entries must be picked up at times listed above or item will be subject to disposal.

Food Division (Pee Wee, Junior, Senior, & Adult)

- All Food must be exhibited with Disposable Boxes or Aluminum Pans with lids
- Exceptions for the Decorated Cakes (Must be Covered in Plastic if box is not feasible)
- All Food Must be made from Scratch, No Box enhanced Recipes Accepted
- Recipe must be displayed on a 3x5 Index Card, without exhibitors' name
- No Food Entry that requires refrigeration will be allowed
- All Food Item must be completely Edible (INSIDE & OUT)
- All food items will be cut and tasted by a committee of judges
- All Entries will be judged on Presentation, Quality, and Flavor

Cakes (limited to 20 X 20in including base)

**Decorated cake entries must exhibit only edible items (inside and out) or will be disqualified*

Hand Crafting and Fine Arts Division (Pee Wee, Junior, Senior, & Adult)

- Only one (1) entry per person in any class.
- All entries must be matted or framed.
- All clothing constructed entries must be free of rips and tears, in good condition, well pressed and completely finished.
- Needlework entries must be clean and completely finished including blocking, framing.
