# **Community Colleges Get the Green Light to Offer 4-year Degrees**

With the passage of Arizona Senate Bill 1453 (SB1453) on May 4, 2021, Arizona joins 23 other states that allow community colleges to offer bachelor's degrees. A historic moment for the Maricopa Community Colleges system and state, 25 years in the making.

The Chancellor's Executive Council (CEC) has identified, and the Governing Board supports, MCCCD's first bachelor's degrees for development. The intent is to seek approval from the Governing Board and Higher Learning Commission (HLC) to offer these awards to our community in Fall 2023.



A Bachelor's Degree Advisory Committee developed a list of initial high-growth, high-demand areas in the sectors that were discussed throughout the legislative process (Health Care, Information Technology, Education, and Public Safety) for college teams to determine a regional programmatic offering structure.

The next step in this historic journey is the development of the curriculum for each proposed award.

MCCCD looks forward to offering additional baccalaureate degrees in high-demand industry sectors, such as Nursing and Respiratory Care, as we build a 3–5-year plan to guide these efforts into the future.

# **MCCRA Constitution Flexes to Meet Changing Times**

Problems, changes, "return to normal," "new normals." We see these terms in the news, and it seems they are going to be with us for the foreseeable future. Even before the pandemic, MCCRA was facing issues of declining numbers of dues-paying members and few members being actively involved. Many newly-retired faculty weren't joining the association and of those who did, most weren't willing to give their time and energy to the operation of it. Of course, the pandemic made all of this worse.

MCCRA President Ann Oehmke said the Constitution was due for an update, and during the pandemic seemed like a good time to do it, so a small group started it and then shared their efforts with the larger group.

All Maricopa Community College employees become MCCRA members upon retirement. The increasing number of people retiring has opened the association to a much larger pool of active members and MCCRA is already seeing an influx of new people and higher energy into the organization.

The previous version required a board member from each college, and while this is a very desirable goal, it is probably not realistic. Wording was changed to allow more flexible representation, still not precluding one-rep-per-college.

The pandemic has changed forever the way we work, meet, and interact; so too with MCCRA. Language was changed to allow both board meetings and general meetings to be held via online video conferencing, as well as online voting. The timing of meetings and elections was loosened a bit and placed at the discretion of the Board.

While it is the MCCRA Constitution, we realize it includes several operational issues which would typically be specified in bylaws. Simply put, MCCRA has no official bylaws. Consensus was that to include a few operational parameters for future guidance would not harm the integrity of the document as a Constitution.

# Constitution of the Maricopa Community Colleges Retirees' Association

#### Article 1. Name

The name of the organization shall be the Maricopa Community Colleges Retirees' Association (MCCRA).

### Article 2. Purpose

- Inform members of changes in ASRS and Social Security benefits.
- 2) Raise funds for endowed scholarships.
- 3) Provide information to current Maricopa Community Colleges District employees preparing for retirement.
- 4) Relate to governmental units relative to retirement programs.
- Facilitate communication for the benefit of employees and/or students, when appropriate.
- Inform members of links to relevant community resources and activities.

#### **Article 3. Affiliation**

The Maricopa Community Colleges Retirees' Association will have a legal relationship to the operation of the Maricopa Community Colleges District and can affiliate with federal, state, and local associations that will help achieve the purpose of the organization and/or enhance the general welfare of the membership.

#### Article 4. Membership

- All persons retired from the Maricopa Community Colleges
   District will become members of the Maricopa Community
   Colleges Retirees' Association upon retirement.
- 2) Annual dues of \$25 and a valid email address are requested.
- The primary means of communicating with the general membership will be the MCCRA website www.mccrassoc.org, email distribution list, and/or newsletter.

#### **Article 5. Board of Directors**

- The MCCRA Board of Directors shall be composed of association members representing the ten Maricopa Community Colleges and the District Office.
- 2) Board members shall be elected for three-year terms, with one third of Board positions up for election each year.
- 3) Members may volunteer for election or accept the nomination of a current or past Board member.
- 4) Elections shall be conducted annually and the Board will notify members of open Board positions via the website, the email distribution list, and the Fall newsletter.
- 5) Election of Board members may be done via U.S. Postal Service mail or an online voting system, as determined by the Board.
- New Board members take office in January following the election.
- 7) Removal of a person or persons from the Board or from the Executive Committee for cause shall be approved by a two-thirds vote of the Board.
- 8) The Board may fill a midterm vacancy on the Board by naming a replacement to serve the remainder of term with a simple majority vote.
- 9) A quorum shall be a simple majority of Board members.

#### **Article 6. Officers of Board of Directors**

- 1) Officers constitute the Executive Committee.
- 2) Officers are President, President-elect, Treasurer, and Secretary.
- 3) The Board will elect officers from members of the Board.
- 4) Officers shall sit on the Board with full voting rights, except the President, who votes only to break a tie.
- 5) In January following an election year, the new Board will meet to elect officers and the previous President shall preside at Board meetings until a successor is named.
- 6) The Board may fill a vacancy on the Executive Committee to serve an unexpired term with a simple majority.
- 7) A Webmaster, Newsletter Editor, Legislative Liaison and/or Parliamentarian may be appointed by the President with the Board's approval to meet with the Board in an advisory capacity.

#### **Article 7. Amendments to Constitution**

- 1) This Constitution can only be changed by the vote of the Board.
- Amendments shall be considered at a general meeting, as set forth by Article 8 below and the Board shall make a good faith effort to notify all board members of a prospective vote to alter this document.
- 3) A two-thirds percentage of Board members who vote for the proposed change shall be required to adopt an amendment or amendments to this Constitution.
- 4) Voting on amendments may be done via U.S. Postal Service mail or an online voting system, as determined by the Board.

#### **Article 8. General Meeting**

- The Board may call a meeting of the entire membership as necessary at a meeting place and time determined by the Board.
- 2) Notification of a general membership meeting shall be placed on the MCCRA website for at least 30 days prior to the meeting date, and shall be sent to the membership email list at least 15 days in advance prior to meeting
- 3) Notification of a general meeting shall include the agenda.
- 4) The format of a general meeting may be in person or via online teleconferencing, as determined by the Board.

#### Article 9. Dissolution and Disbursement of Assets

- In the event of the dissolution of the Maricopa Community Colleges District Retirees' Association, all of the remaining assets of the organization shall go to the general scholarship fund of the Maricopa Foundation.
- Upon dissolution of the association, no part of the earnings or assets of the Maricopa Community Colleges Retirees' Association shall benefit any member, Board member, or officer of the organization.

# PC Receives a Record Donation from Alumnus

Jay Faulkner, Phoenix College alumnus class of 1947, became the largest individual donor to PC, the MCCCD

Foundation and the Maricopa Community College District, with a bequest of \$4.7 million to the Faulkner ACE Endowment. The bequest brings Faulkner's lifetime giving to the PC ACE Program to \$5.7 million. Born in 1926 in Phoenix, Arizona, Faulkner passed away in February 2021.

Faulkner was passionate about supporting disadvantaged students, and in 2004, he established the Jay Faulkner Achieving a College Education Endowment to provide financial support to first-generation and minority students. The PC ACE Program enrolls 320 students annually, with a completion rate of 90%. In 2014, in recognition of his contributions to PC, the Jay Faulkner Memorial Atrium was dedicated in his honor, and Faulkner was celebrated and named to the PC Alumni Hall of Fame. In 2020, the college created the Jay Faulkner Memorial Mesquite Court, an outdoor seating area for students, employees, and the community to gather.

# **Governing Board Announcement | May 11, 2021**

The MCCCD Governing Board has extended the contract of Dr. Steven R. Gonzales to serve as the Interim Chancellor of the Maricopa County Community College District through June 2023. This appointment represents continuity at this time of transition from the impact of the pandemic and a move toward greater stability for the District and the communities we serve.

Dr. Gonzales has been serving as Interim Chancellor since January 2020. During Dr. Gonzales' time as Interim Chancellor he has dealt with the unexpected impact of a pandemic, which generated enrollment and financial concerns, and a cybersecurity challenge. He has demonstrated a renewed commitment to shared governance and collaboration with the faculty, staff, and Governing Board members to advance the District's mission. Further he was actively involved in the passage of AZ SB 1453 that allows community colleges to offer baccalaureate programs, thus growing access, equity, and affordability for our students.

# Meet Dr. Sian Proctor

Approximately 21 years ago, I was involved in the interview and selection process to hire Sian Proctor as geoscientist faculty member at South Mountain Community College. During my role as Academic Vice President, I had the opportunity to participate in many hiring committees. Every now and then I would discover someone who stood out, was truly focused and unique in multiple ways. Sian Proctor was one of those special people. She has a B.S. in Environmental Science, an M.S. in Geology, and a Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction: Science Education. She was a person with dreams, big dreams.

Dr. Proctor quickly proved herself to be a unique faculty member with energy and drive to continually improve and gain skills. Sian had great interest in using multiple technologies in her teaching activities. She has completed several sabbaticals, the most recent was at ASU's Center for Education Through Exploration creating virtual field trips. She completed a 2012-2013 sabbatical at the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) focusing on developing curriculum dealing with the science of natural disasters. Other projects focused upon the integration of technology in her teaching activities.

Sian is a pilot who wanted to be an astronaut. She is a Major in the Civil Air Patrol and serves as an aerospace educator. She was a finalist for the 2009 NASA Astronaut

Program and was only a few positions away from being selected. She was involved in the first Hawaii Space Analog and Simulation Mission. In that simulation she assisted in the investigation of food preparation for long duration missions to the moon and mars. She was involved in a YouTube series and filmed Meals for Mars. In addition, Sian is often

on television including the Discovery Channel, and was on the 2016 PBS program Genius with Stephen Hawking.

On September 15, 2021, Dr. Proctor was launched into orbit as the pilot of the Inspiration4 space capsule; the capsule was named the Dragon. Sian is proud to say she "flew with the dragon." She became the first Black woman to pilot a spacecraft. Sian has dreams and has found a way to live every one of them. The Maricopa Community Colleges are fortunate to have her as a member of the family. I made a really good hiring decision!

# Inspiration4 – All-Civilian Crew Launched into Space



History was made on September 15, 2021, when the world's first all-civilian human spaceflight was launched into orbit from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Cape Canaveral, Florida on a three-day journey around Earth. This unique event was experienced by one member of the Maricopa family, Dr. Sian Proctor.

The 51-year-old

entrepreneur, educator, trained pilot, and voice in the space exploration community, was announced as a final crew member of the Inspiration4 space mission in March 2021.

Dr. Proctor is a geoscientist, explorer, space artist, and astronaut, and has been a geology professor at SMCC for over 20 years. On the Inspiration4 mission, she served as mission pilot and assisted commander and benefactor Jared Isaacman and other crew members Hayley Arceneaux and Chris Sembroski.

Inspiration4, funded by SpaceX, raised \$220 million for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital to help end childhood cancer. The journey saw the quartet free flying through Earth's orbit, spinning around the planet once every 90 minutes. The passengers, uninhibited by the restrictions of gravity, floated in the spacecraft and captured

panoramic views of planet Earth. Traveling weightless at over 17,000 miles per hour, the crew conducted experiments designed to expand our knowledge of the universe.

Dr. Proctor is also a poet and space artist. Her goal in life is to inspire others to produce art and strive for equality, be inclusive, think about diversity. She wants to create a Just, Equitable, Diverse, and Inclusive world (J.E.D.I. space) as the founder of Space2inspire — or a unique

space to inspire those within your reach and beyond.



SCC librarian Danielle Carlock lends new meaning to lending library. What started as a sabbatical project on food insecurity for students grew into so much more for not only students, faculty and staff at SCC but the Maricopa County community.

The free Maricopa Native Seed Library offers seeds collected from Tonto National Forest (under permit), the SCC garden, a few donations and even her own backyard. Seed libraries are located at SCC, PC, GWCC and MCC's Red Mountain campus.

Some of the popular food seeds include Sonoran Winter Wheat, Salt River Pima Pea and Desert Chia. The plant packets contain basic information about the level of difficulty and a link to the plants profile page on the seed library website. <a href="https://libguides.maricopa.edu">https://libguides.maricopa.edu</a> seed

Native seeds are free to anyone and come in packets of 20 to 25. Anyone can take home up to three packets from the Fannin Library at PC and the MCC Red Mountain Library which also offers curbside pickup.

Also at Red Mountain is an ethnobotanical garden recently established thanks to an Arizona Lottery Gives Back grant awarded via the Maricopa Community Colleges Foundation.
