The weather forecast is ominous ... small craft warning. Winds are forecast

to gust to 40+ mph or more. It is supposed rain an inch or more. Not the forecast you want going into a winter sailboat race. We have a partial crew; winter racing is tough on schedules. We don't have our critical foredeck crew, which we need to fly a spinnaker or change sails. The crew we had wanted to be competitive! We will have to choose our sails for the conditions wisely.

As skipper, I feel a heavy responsibility to balance safety and competitiveness. I wake up in the morning and check the weather. The forecast is brutal. I realize this day could be tricky and dangerous. Doesn't sound like a good day to sail or race.



It is Saturday, December 7, 2019, the second race of the winter series sponsored by BYC Racing. Our boat *E-Ticket* and crew won the winter series last year. It is a 5-race series, raced 1x per month November to March. *E-Ticket* was 3rd in the November race and we need a good result today.

The racing skippers meet on the BYC race deck to choose the course. We all are seasoned racers and realize the seriousness of the day. We choose a 7.7-mile course, starting at the Benicia Marina Entrance and proceeding to Buoy 21A



(off of W 9th St Park). From there we sail to the Benicia/Martinez Bridge (Buoy #3), then head back to the Marina entrance to finish the race. Most skippers decide to not fly spinnakers due to the high wind forecast. We prepare the boat for the race, adding reef lines in case we need to reef (shorten) the mainsail. We discuss and decide to fly our heavy-duty # 2 sail, which can handle medium to heavy winds.

The race starts with moderate winds out of the SSE (South SouthEast). Clouds are building and the rain is misting intermittently. We do a reverse start, where the faster rated boats start later. Theoretically, all boats should finish at

the same time, all things being equal. *E-Ticket* is the fastest rated boat and therefore starts last. We head towards 21A (W 9th) with our sails out wide to capture the South wind. The moderate wind fuels our speed. We gain on our primary competitors, *Warwhoop* and *Brandy*.

They round 21A and we head towards Buoy #3. The wind is close to our highest point of sail coming from Martinez. Our competitors sail a faster course more off the wind. We keep our boat pointing high into the wind, hoping to make the

First Street marker without tacking. The wind is building and we now have all the wind we can readily handle.

Our calculations prove right; we make First Street without tacking. Our two competitors have to tack away to make First Street. The result: *E-Ticket* taking the lead by a small margin.

Our three boats race to #3. *E Ticket* chooses the deeper water; *Warwhoop* and *Brandy* run a straighter line on the North side of the Strait. The current is changing from a flood to an ebb. Different currents run throughout the racing area. The wind is building to well into 20+ mph. The rain has increased and we are all speeding across the Strait on the forward press of the approaching storm.



We round Buoy #3 with a few boat lengths of lead on our competitors. The wind continues to increase, now well into the 20's and gusting into the low 30's. The wind angle is deep, allowing us to run our sails wide and fast as we head back towards the finish. Most crew is on the high side rail as we lean heavily in the wind and charge toward the finish. The main and hub trimmer are busy adjusting the sails to the wind and gusts. Crew are calling out the gusts. We are at maximum speed and performance.

All three boats are going fast and maxed near their top speeds. The conditions are great for a deep reach with all crew busy and adrenaline pumping. The wind is averaging 30+ mph and gusting well into the high 30's. The wind angle to our sailing angle is ideal for handling maximum wind, and we are at our maximum limit of speed for the wind and angle. The wakes behind our boats are tremendous and impressive.

The finish approaches with our lead stretching. WE DID IT—won a much-needed race under challenging conditions with excellent competition.

It is another great day of racing on Benicia's Riviera. Not bad for racing in December on the front of a strong storm!
