BYC Safety Information



Carbon Monoxide

It is a Cal. State Law that Carbon Monoxide decal is placed facing out on the exterior of the stern or transom of vessel. There is also a decal that is to be placed by the wheel or where the driver is sitting. These stickers are free and are available at the Benicia Yacht Club by the Cruisers sign-up board. Carbon Monoxide will be around the back of the boat when engines or generators are running. It is always a good idea to have monoxide sensors on your vessel, especially in the sleeping quarters.

The Cal. Operational Law can be found on page 16 in The Cal. Guide to Boating and Safety book.

<u>Pot</u>

It is against Federal Law to be smoking recreational cannabis on your vessel at any time, even at a dock since you are in federal waters. The Coast Guard enforces federal laws.

Age Restrictions

No person under16 years of age may operate a boat with a motor of more than 15 horsepower, except for a sailboat that does not exceed 30 feet in length, or a dinghy used directly between a moored boat and the shore (or between two moored boats). The law allows children 12-15 years of age to operate boats with a motor of more than 15 horsepower or sailboats over 30 feet if supervised on board by an adult at least 18 years of age. Violating these provisions constitutes an infraction.

The Cal. Age Restrictions can be found on page 16 in The Cal. Guide to Boating Law and Safety book.

Mandatory Boater Education Requirements

Beginning on January 1, 2018, recreational power boat operators who are age 20 and younger shall be required to carry a boater education card. Once issued by the Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW), the California Boating Card remains valid for boat operator's lifetime. DBW will issue the cards to persons who provide proof that an approved vessel operator examination has been passed since January 1, 2015 Approved courses may be found online at www.CaliforniaBoaterCard.com.

The California Boater Card requirement will be phased in

over the next several years based on operations.

January 1, 2023	persons 50 years of age or younger
January 1, 2024	persons 60 years of age or younger
January 1, 2025	all persons regardless of age

2023 Boaters Safety Recommendations and Check Up

1. Check to be sure you have your new registration on the boat and have put your new decals (2023)on the front of your boat. If you are a documented boat you should have up-to-date Coast Guard documentation paper on board and know where it is.

2. Check all shore power cords and ends to see that there is not any corrosion on the connections; put Noalox dielectric grease on the ends after cleaning them. Corrosion on the ends can start a fire.

3. Check batteries to see there is not any corrosion on the terminals, and the batteries have the proper level of water.

4. Check oil and oil filters and fuel filters; they should be changed once a year or at 100 hours engine running time.

5. Check engine valve covers and oil pans to be sure you do not have any oil leaks. Be sure the area around the engine is clean without any oil or grease in the bilge.

6. Inspect and check oil level on transmissions.

7. Check to see if stuffing boxes on shafts are dripping at proper rate.

8. Be sure the bilge is clean without any oil or dirty water sitting there.

9. Keep track of when Zincs were changed on the engine and running gear. This can be very important to the life of the equipment.

10. Check to see that all systems are working—horn, navigation lights, and all fire extinguishers to be sure they are in the green.

11. Check the batteries on all smoke and carbon monoxide units to see they are working.

12. Check dates on visual distress signals for day and night use. They now have a strobe light that takes 3 C batteries so you would not have to buy flares every 3 years.

13. Check on Personal Flotation Devices (PFD) or life jackets. Be sure they are readily available and in good shape. That means clean without holes or mildew from the winter rains. If you want to count the inflatable jackets they must be worn at all times. They should be checked to see they are in the green. They are not legal if the person wearing the jacket is under 16 years of age. There must be one PFD for each person on the boat and they must be the right size for the person wearing the jacket. It is always a good idea to buy a small strobe light to have on every PFD.

14. This is the time to check your VHS radio out. Call the Benicia Marina on channel 16 and they will tell you what channel to go to, and ask them how they are hearing you. Do not ask for a radio check on channel 16. Channel 16 is only used for hailing other vessels or calling the Coast Guard for Emergencies.

15. Check all motors and anchor windless, radar and GPS Systems. Many times things just happen over the winter rains.

16. Check your fresh water system out. If you can change all the water do it. It would be a good idea to put a couple of capfuls of bleach in the tank. Keep tank full so you will have water for any emergencies.

17. You should have a copy of your insurance papers on board, many marinas make you show them.

18. If you are one of the old timers you should know the government has done away with The Loran System. This system was used for navigation before GPS.

19. If your boat uses gasoline you should put in a small bottle of dry gas. You can get it at any automotive store. Because they are putting Ethanol in the gas it will attract water and condensation in the tank of your boat.

20. If you put white vinegar in the sinks and heads it will clean them and help keep them in working order.

21. It is a good idea to keep your holding tank empty and your water tanks full due to where we live (e.g., earthquakes and other emergencies).

22. It is recommended you get a Vessel Safety Check done by The Coast Guard Auxiliary or The U.S. Power Squadrons. You can call Paul Brighton's cell 707-373-1077 or James Minkel cell 707-208-5191 to set a time and date for the Vessel Safety Check . <u>It is FREE.</u>

23. It is a good time to check your anchor line and/or chain. Check all docking lines that have been exposed to weather.

24. If by any chance you have mice or other varmints, buy some liquid peppermint—they won't stay around long.

25. One of the new things The Coast Guard safety checks is all fire extinguishers cannot be more than 12 years old.

Julie Thomas, former Benicia resident and community volunteer, passed gracefully at 101+ years young earlier this January 2023. Julie was a long-
