


RACE 24–Season Finale




Veterans Day 2022

BYC Safety Information for January 2023



Carbon Monoxide

It is a Cal. State Law that Carbon Monoxide decal is placed facing out on the exterior of the stern or transom of vessel. There is also a decal that is to be placed by the wheel or where the driver is sitting. These stickers are free and are available at the BYC Club by the Cruisers sign up board. Carbon Monoxide will be around the back of the boat when engines or generators are running. It is always a good idea to have monoxide sensors on your vessel especially in the sleeping quarters.

Boating Law The Cal. Operational Law can be found on page 16 in The Cal. Guide to Boating Law and Safety book

Pot

It is against Federal Law to be smoking recreational cannabis on your vessel at any time, even at a dock since you are in federal waters. The Coast Guard enforces federal laws.

Age Restrictions

No person under 16 years of age may operate a boat with a motor of more than 15 horsepower, except for a sailboat that does not exceed 30 feet in length, or a dinghy used directly between a moored boat and the shore (or between two moored boats). The law allows children 12-15 years of age to operate boats with a motor of more than 15 horsepower or sailboats over 30 feet if supervised on board by an adult at least 18 years of age. Violating these provisions constitutes an infraction.

Mandatory Boater Education Requirements.

Beginning on January 1, 2018, recreational power boat operators who are age 20 and younger shall be required to carry a boater education card. Once issued by the Division of Boating and Waterways, the California Boating remains valid for boat operator's lifetime. DBW will issue the cards to persons who provide proof that an approved vessel operator examination has been passed since January 1, 2015

Approved courses may be found online at www.CaliforniaBoaterCard.com.

The California Boater Card requirement will be phased in over the next several years based on operator age.



January 1, 2020	persons 35 years of age or younger
January 1, 2021	persons 40 years of age or younger

January 1, 2023	persons 50 years of age or younger
January 1, 2024	persons 60 years of age or younger
January 1, 2025	All persons regardless of age

Boat America

Boat America is a boating certificate class that offers an in-depth and interesting boating safety course, and provides the knowledge needed to obtain a boating certificate.

Some insurance companies will also offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete this course.

TOPICS INCLUDE

Introduction to Boating – Types of power boats, boating vocabulary, sailboats, paddle boats, powering boats, and engine types.

Boating Law – Boat registration, regulations, hull identification numbers, required safety equipment, Federal boating law, state boating law, and reporting accidents.

Safety Equipment – Life jackets, fire extinguishers, sound-producing devices, visual distress signals, anchors, and other safety equipment.

Safe Operation and Navigation – Buoys and beacons, aids to navigation, navigation rules, docking, and the dangers of alcohol on the water.

Boating Emergencies – Hypothermia, boating accidents, man overboard, capsizing, emergency radio calls, carbon monoxide dangers, and weather.

Trailing – Types of trailers, lights, hitches, towing a trailer.

Sports and Boating – Water-skiing, hunting and hunting gear, PWC operation, and other boating tips.
