

FROM THE HELM



Half-way through the term, a look back at progress on priorities may be in order.

We are now fully open which is an achievement by itself. Staffing continues to be a focus as we develop a stable crew to serve expanded membership and events.

Sailing continues with Beer Can races on Thursdays. The weather has been decent and there has been a lot of fun. Some new boats are joining in. The Lighthouse Race is coming up in July. Jazz Cup planning for Labor Day weekend has begun.

Cruising is full steam ahead with more boats and land cruisers participating each month. Cruises to Marin, Pittsburg, Petaluma and Napa are in the books. Coming up are trips to Solano, Delta Marina (including RVs), St Francis, Encinal and others. October's Harvest Cruise will go to Richmond, Sausalito and Oakland. Steve Penny and the Cruise Directors have lots more good times planned.

From a financial perspective **we are solidly in the black.** Food and beverage pricing adjustments have put the bar and restaurant in a better revenue-cost balance. Event revenues from Opening Day as well as private member and non-member events are a plus. The influx of new members is providing increased funding from dues and revenue from their use of the Club.

It is great to see the **number of new members joining & participating** in Club events & activities.

We still have an opening for an Entertainment Chair. Please let me know if you are interested. Meanwhile, we are grateful others are stepping up to fill in the void. We have had some good parties.

Our biggest unresolved challenge is our building renovation effort. Some repairs have been deferred for more than 10 years. Last June we got authorization from the membership to pursue financing for renovation, but progress on that front has been limited. We delayed the borrowing and dues increase planned at the end of 2021 because we were still not fully open or on our feet at that time. We have scaled back our ambitions to just the most critical items in the plan. To stay on a sound financial footing into the future, we plan to increase dues to provide for renovation in addition to keeping abreast of inflation.




Amanda and Skyelar, who will always remember him for his homemade Shirley Temples and the ability to always make them laugh.

FACILITY UPDATE

After a pause at the beginning of the 2022, the Capital Expenditure Oversight Committee met in June. It was decided that renovations be limited to the most critical items, namely:

- repainting and repair of selected exterior walls, and
- the Regatta Room HVAC project.

Contractors are being solicited and cost estimates are being obtained for the critical items.

Over the winter and spring, our architect completed drawings for the HVAC permit submission. Those drawings included the design base for future projects. The drawings were submitted to the City of Benicia. Our HVAC contractor and carpentry contractor will submit additional permits as needed once hired.

In June 2021 we considered financing for the larger (\$600,000) project which was intended to address a full range of needs. The timing wasn't good because the Club was still only partially open in early 2022. We are back on track now but are planning a more modest project in the near term. Once we get detailed estimates for our highest priorities, we will make a final decision on borrowing needs and strategy going forward.

The original plan was to increase dues \$50.00 per quarter at the end of last year to cover debt service on the larger project. At this point we are considering an increase in October of half of that depending on how the overall capital and operating budgets work out and what is needed in addition to address inflation.
