#### Benicia Yacht Club Presents Our 33rd Annual







For the **Chasing the Moon Race**, the challenge is to sail to Red Marker #8 just off Point Pinole at the center of San Pablo Bay, and return in the dark. On July 23, we were blessed with an ebb current that help push us to our mark, and brisk winds at about 25 mph.

This race starts differently than our normal races. Instead of a starting line with a committee boat, we had a reverse start from the entrance of the marina at times assigned to each boat. (A reverse start gives specific times for each boat to cross the start line based on their rating, the object being that ideally all boats could finish at the same time.) Our start was at 6:07 30 sec pm.

We had a great start, and headed up the Strait to the Carquinez Bridge, averaging 7 knots between the speed of the boat and the ebb current—not bad. Within about 40 minutes we passed under the bridge into the open waters of the bay, where we started to experience the building chop. After a couple of tacks around the opening of the Napa River, we were able to set a lay line to Marker #8, which was



about 8 miles away. We were averaging 6 knots, meaning it would take us about 1-1/2 hours to get to the mark, and then an 11-1/2 mile trip back home for the finish.

Winds stayed pretty brisk for the entirety of the San Pablo Bay portion of the race, and keeping control of the boat without being overpowered required constant attention by the crew and—at this point—the weary captain. Even so, the guys did great and we stayed ahead of the pack, trailing *Sand Piper* who remained our class' leader throughout the race. We finally reached Marker #8 a bit after 8 pm, and just like last year, *E-Ticket* and *Warwhoop* were right behind us

as we rounded the mark and set our sails for the 11-1/2 mile downwind sail back.

The sunset was beautiful as we headed into darkness, and shortly after sunset the moon rose over the refineries with an orange tinge from the fires. Sailing in the dark requires keen attention to the instruments, as well as watching for other vessels and obstacles. As we approached the Bridge and entered the Strait, the swells lessened as we headed to our familiar sailing grounds. We finished at 10:14:07 pm, and the crew put the sails away in short order, all of us invigorated by the experience.

I would like to finish with a special acknowledgement to Captain Daniel Carnahan, our leader for the BYC races. These events don't happen on their own, and Captain Dan puts in hours of work making sure that everything is in order, including planning the events, coordinating all the paperwork for each boat (yes, there is paperwork) notifying all of the authorities about the race, and whatever must be done. Without his dedication to Benicia Yacht Club and those of us where sailing is not just recreation, but a passion, the vigorous sailing program we enjoy simply would not happen. I certainly would not have considered venturing into the middle of the San Pablo Bay in the dark for entertainment were it not for Captain Dan!

So to Captain Dan, fair winds and following seas to you, and even though we did not finish first this week, because of your efforts, there is always next week.

# The Building Project is Underway

The BYC building project is moving forward through planning. The purpose of this article is to report on progress and ask for Club input and help.

You may not see much happening yet, but the planning is moving forward. The steering committee has met and various members are working on parts of the project and critical pre-project activities.

**Finance:** We worked with our accountant to make our first bank submission. We are on round 2 of responding to questions.

**Planning and Design:** We met with an architect to discuss some short-term issues, project permitting and the overall project plan. We will be contacting another architect and a couple of general contractors to work out short-term and longer-term plans. In early September the steering committee will be meeting, where we will work to agree on a shared vision for the project. If you have any ideas, please feel free to forward them to Andy or Richard.

**Work Progress:** Some related work outside of the main project continues. Quotations to upgrade and replace our leaking water supply line have been obtained and are being reviewed. We have obtained quotations for HVAC work and are working on plans for related building modifications to ask for refinement of those quotations. We will be looking at siding, framing repair as needed and window modifications for the East and North walls soon.
