Election 2025 - Benicia Yacht Club Needs You!!

** Candidate Nominating Committee and Board Openings **

<u>Calling all fellow Benicia Yacht Club (BYC) Owners!</u>
Members of BYC share ownership and oversight of the Club and facilities.

Believe it or not, it's already that time of year when BYC starts the process to establish next year's nominations for the Board of Directors and Flag Officers. Aside from two of the four Director positions, all other positions will be open in this year's election: Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, and Treasurer. We are now looking for interested Board candidates as well as people willing to serve on the Nominating Committee for 2025.

BYC Bylaws Specify How Our Elections Take Place

By August 23 a Nominating Committee will be formed by final approval from the current Board of Directors. This committee will solicit applicants for each open Board position, verify applicant eligibility and qualifications, interview the applicants, and develop the final election slate. Nominations can also be made by petition. The Nominating Committee will be led by me as Junior Staff Commodore in accordance with the bylaws.

The election takes place in October, but the Nominating Committee must make its report by the September Board Meeting (Sept. 9) so ballots can be prepared and mailed out and so candidates' statements can make it into the October *Wind Word* newsletter.

THE DEADLINE FOR CANDIDATE APPLICATIONS IS THE END OF AUGUST

AS A CLUB OWNER, YOU SHOULD CONSIDER RUNNING BECAUSE:

- 1. **Your opinion matters**. If you leave governance of the Club to others, you risk losing a very important right that you have—the right to decide. Your opinion is as worthy as any other member's view and a variety of opinions being heard by the Board strengthens the Club.
- 2. Ownership decisions are needed to keep our finances in order and to move the Club in a positive direction.
- 3. The Board of Directors determines the house rules of the Club in accordance with our bylaws. Rules need reviewing to keep them up to date.
- 4. You provide a needed service to your fellow members.
- 5. **Being on the Board is a good opportunity to know what is going on** and to get to know others in the Club better.
- 6. You get a special name tag and can wear a uniform at meetings and on special occasions.

 - **—BOATING SAFETY—Max 20** (5 points for appointing a Safety Officer for the current year. 5 points for holding a Vessel Safety Check (VSC) day. 3 points each for conducting an ongoing, formal safety education program.)
 - -CLUB NEWSLETTERS PICYA/ RBOC-Max 10 (5 points for each service activity)
 - —RBOC LEGISLATIVE LETTERS—Max 10 (5 points each for Response to Alerts)
 - —OPENING DAY—Max 30 (Regional Opening Day & Opening Day on the Bay Boats)
- <u>Scholarships</u>—There are no applicants as of June 7. The scholarship is approximately \$2600. Apply here: https://picya.org/picya-scholarships
- <u>International Order of the Blue Gavel Picnic is</u> <u>on July 12.</u> All past commodores should have received information.
