BYC Facility Renovation Update

By the time this is in print you will have seen some progress on the siding repair front. Our contractor has begun work and we are anxiously awaiting the results of the preliminary carpentry exploratory work.

The Regatta Room HVAC project is a bit more complicated. We were hoping to avoid borrowing for it, but that doesn't seem to be the best way forward. Doing half of the project doesn't seem to be a reasonable way to go because of inefficiencies on the contracting end. We are continuing the permitting process considering starting the carpentry, and meanwhile seeking funding to complete the full HVAC project before winter.

We have had some very promising discussions with lenders and believe that BYC can come to a decent deal for a smaller amount of lending. At this point we are seeking to borrow \$200,000 for the priority projects and for refinancing our original member loans.




<u>RACING DURING WEEK 16- Uncle Neal's Wild Ride – July 16th</u>

On this week's race, Randy Norman asked if he could bring his wife Eve McCarthy-Norman's uncle Neal. He and his wife, Aunt Margarite, were visiting from Chicago, and Uncle Neal has always wanted a ride on a sailboat. We were full, but since he was going to keep his role to passenger, he grabbed what we call

the margarita seat, strapped in, and off we went.

This week *Warwhoop* was back in the races. It is good to have Chuck Hooper back after some pretty intense repairs.

The winds were typical for this time of year, initially in the mid 20s, and then declining from there. We had no committee boat anchored out, so the committee went to *Let it Be* which is berthed in the marina. The start line was a line from a flag on *Let it Be*, crossing the starting buoy, and as announced for the evening a line across the entire Strait.



The first mark was green 21, off of 9th street, so to get the best course we started as close as we could to the Martinez side of the Strait, and we were able to make the mark in just a couple of tacks. We gave Uncle Neal a little taste of being on a sailboat that was overpowered with rails in the water as we led the race to the first mark. As we rounded the mark, the winds started to subside, and by the time we got to the next mark, we were no longer in the lead. Ah well, it was good while it lasted. We finished 3rd of 4



boats in our fleet. Even so, we had a terrific time and I was glad I could fulfill one item on Uncle Neal's bucket list with what at times was a wild ride.

Our next race was Saturday, the Lighthouse Race. This is the longest race of the year, and if you take a straight route, it is 32 miles roundtrip. Apparently one wild ride for Uncle Neal was not enough, and he showed up again to join our crew of Andy Zinkevich, Randy Norman, Fred and Gary Johnson. I guess folks in Chicago are tough, and windy conditions do not deter

them. Since this was Uncle Neal's second race, he earned his *Playpen2* shirt, so now he is an official

member of the crew. Congratulations, Uncle Neal!

The Lighthouse Race is a reverse start, and the challenge isn't so much the distance, as it is the currents and tricky winds of San Pablo Bay. All projections were that the winds were to be mild, ranging from 4-6 mph in the morning to maybe 15 mph. At least those were the projections. In fact, when we left the marina, the winds were about 20 mph with gusts much higher.

The first boat to start was *Sail la Vie*, and we never could get close to her in the entire race. The challenge was to get around



the lighthouse before the currents changed, and if we could, this race would be a piece of cake. In fact, that is not what happened, and a lot of our time was tacking at the top of San Pablo Bay, dodging the islands of the Sisters, anchored barges, industrial mooring balls, and then of course the Brother's lighthouse itself.

We spinnakered most the way home. Our finish time was 7 hours and 15 minutes, and we finished 3rd out of 4. Even so—we had a great time, and the bonus was sharing our wild rides with Uncle Neal, who from all indications enjoyed every minute! Fair winds and following seas to all, and to Uncle Neal, glad to have shared the thrill of a couple of BYC races with you.
