Irish tenor Mark Forest will return to lead the singing at the Eucharistic Adoration. Lunch is provided. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available, and the Conference will conclude with Mass celebrated by the Most Reverend Charles J. Chaput, OFM Cap. 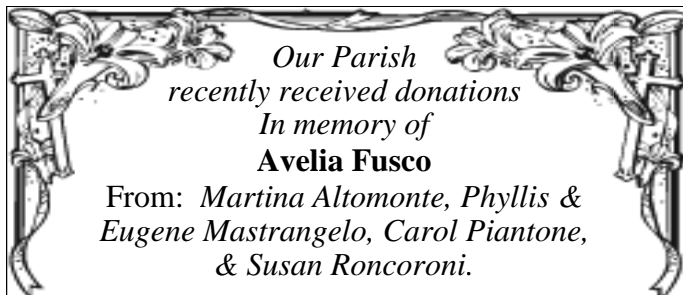

Faith Formation

March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, is the 25th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's landmark encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, the Gospel of Life, in which he offers clear and definitive teaching on a variety of issues concerning human life. This is the first of a six-part series summarizing the encyclical. These articles are being offered to help us recall divinely revealed truths regarding God's precious gift of human life so that our consciences may be formed by the light of that truth.

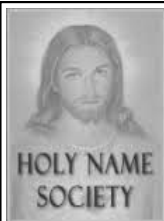
The Gospel of Life is comprised of an introduction, four chapters (Present Day Threats to Human Life, The Christian Message Concerning Life, God's Holy Law, and For a New Culture of Human Life) and a conclusion.

John Paul begins his encyclical by affirming and repeating the extensive list of acts condemned by the Second Vatican Council (Constitution on the Church, 27) as sins against life:

- Any type of murder (genocide, abortion, euthanasia, or willful self-destruction),
- whatever violates the integrity of the human person, (mutilation, torments inflicted on the body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself),
- whatever insults human dignity (such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children),
- disgraceful working conditions, where people are treated as mere instruments of gain rather than as free and responsible persons.

We will come to see later in the encyclical that abortion and euthanasia are the two main areas of John Paul's focus.

While lamenting practices once considered criminal and rejected by common sense were gradually becoming socially acceptable, John Paul admits writing the Gospel of Life to be a "precise and vigorous reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability." He also calls his encyclical an appeal to every person to defend and protect God's gift of life.
