



Repent! The Lord is Near!


The holy season of Advent calls to mind the two comings of Christ: His coming as man in Bethlehem two thousand years ago and his coming again at the end of time.

His two-fold coming should guide our Advent reflection, prayer, and sacramental practice. He came in Bethlehem so as to be our Savior and He will come again at the end of time to judge the world on its acceptance or rejection of the Gospel.

On the second Sunday of Advent, we heard the voice of St. John the Baptist calling us to “Repent!” The sacrament of penance is the ordinary means by which God calls us and allows us to experience conversion of heart. In the confessional we personally experience the mercy of God and know that our sins are forgiven. Christ, through the ministry He entrusts to His priests, forgives us our sins in confession. To experience that forgiveness, however, we must use the sacrament well and prepare for it properly.

It is my hope that all the people of Sacred Heart will receive the sacrament of penance prior to Christmas. Whether you choose to confess here or at another parish, please make confession a priority for your spiritual life.

Today’s bulletin contains an examination of conscience which is meant to help you prepare for confession. May the good God move you and inspire you to be reconciled to him through the sacrament of confession.



Christmas on a Sunday?

This year Christmas will be celebrated on a Sunday. This is not a common occurrence. The last time Christmas fell on a Sunday was in 2016 and after this year it will not happen again until 2033.

Christmas on a Sunday presents a unique challenge for parishes whose operational expenses rely on fifty – two Sunday collections a year. We simply need each Sunday’s collection in order to fulfill our mission.

Therefore, I would kindly ask you to make two offerings on Christmas day: your regular Sunday contribution and your Christmas gift to the parish.

To that end there will be two collections on Christmas: the first collection will be for your Christmas offering and the second collection will be for your regular Sunday contribution.

Many thanks for your continual generous support of our parish.

CHRISTMAS COLLECTION

As Christmas approaches and you are occupied with all the shopping and expense that goes with it, I ask you to think seriously about your Christmas contribution to the Parish.

I ask that you not just put something in the Christmas envelope without serious thought. Perhaps you can take a moment to think of how much you will be spending on gifts, decorations and food. Then think about what percentage of that you may be giving in the Christmas collection. If you could consider your Christmas donation as a major gift on your Christmas list it will be a big help to us.

I know that everyone is rightfully concerned with the economy but please remember that if everyone gives just a few dollars less in the collection, the result is a large decrease, while if everyone gives just a few dollars more, there is the opposite result. I am grateful as always for your goodness and generosity.

November Poor Box Offering

We collected \$504.00 in our poor box during the month of November. Thank you! This month's recipient of the poor box offering is St. Francis Inn Ministries located in the Kensington section of Philadelphia.

St. Francis Inn, founded and operated by the Franciscan Friars, describes its mission in the following way:

The Inn has been serving meals to the neediest individuals and families in Philadelphia since 1979. We opened our doors in December of 1979 and have served a meal every day since then. A breakfast of hot or cold cereal or pastries is served three days a week, while we serve a sit-down meal in our dining room every day. We now serve over 350 meals a day with dignity and respect. Our meal is unique because we serve our meals restaurant-style; our guests don't walk through a line to get their food, our compassionate volunteers serve them at their tables. We rely on the generosity of local grocery stores and businesses as well as churches and individuals to donate food so we can serve our daily meals. Volunteers come daily to help cook, serve, and clean. With the help and support of volunteers and benefactors we are able to serve our guests every day with a warm, nourishing meal in a caring and respectful setting.

In addition to the dine-in meals, we also provide food baskets for families and homebound seniors monthly. A mixture of fresh and non-perishable foods supply regular sustenance to those unable to come to our meals. Mail services, phone usage, and many intangible resources also support our guests.



Eucharistic Wednesdays of Advent

The Bishops of the United States have called for a **"Eucharistic Revival"** in our country. Part of their initiative involves added opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration. Each Wednesday of Advent the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for the adoration of the faithful. Exposition will begin at the conclusion of the 8 am Mass and continue until 7 p.m. A sign up sheet will be in the back of the church so as to assure that the Blessed Sacrament is not unattended.



DECEMBER 11, 2022 - THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

A common plot line in theatrical works is that of mistaken identity. The piece could be a farce involving twins who switch roles. Or a serious drama involving the murder of the wrong victim. We the reader or the theater patron either laugh at the first or are shocked by the mistake in the second example.

When Our Lord walked this earth, gracing our planet in ways far beyond a simple tally of them, He had to struggle against a case of mistaken identity held by His fellow Jewish countrymen. It all involved the popular conceptions about the coming Messiah and Our Lord's take on the matter. Over time, the Jews made the Messiah out to be the superhero military leader who would rout the hated Romans. With His invincible army and his blood-stained sword, riding upon a stout steed he would assume a throne of glory and judge the nations.

There was no room here for a gentle Shepherd. Much less an itinerant preacher bred by poverty and hailing from a sleepy hamlet named Nazareth, that was far too insignificant to claim a place on any developed map. Moreover, Jesus' message proved contradictory. On the one hand, it was too startling and demanding for many among the crowds He initially attracted, especially among the Scribes and Pharisees. On the other hand, many found His message hope-filled and promising.

Jesus' precursor was His own cousin, John the Baptist, a rough desert dweller whose volatile style also attracted many followers. But the Baptist got himself jailed because he was not afraid to speak truth to power. The people grew confused when their champion directed them to Jesus. To end the confusion, John sent a delegation to ask Jesus about His credentials.

True to form, Jesus answers the group's question indirectly, challenging their powers of deduction. He pointed out healings of the afflicted that were prophesied about the Redeemer. As the group headed back to the imprisoned John with their report, Jesus raised His voice with a tribute to the Baptist any one of us would like to hear directed our way.

Advent has a penitential aspect about it, less pungent than the penance asked for in Lent, but still penitential. We recall and repent of our sins in preparation for the grand Feast of Christmas. We acknowledge that we have fallen into a state of mistaken identity, choosing all sorts of substitutes for happiness instead of the things of God. Advent urges us to take a trip to the confessional before the big day.

Meanwhile, mistaken identity can make us forget what Christmas is all about. A recent poll conducted by the Lutheran Church found that the largest percentage of Christians interviewed said that Christmas was all about families getting together. A nice response, but what happened to Christmas being about Jesus?

God love you and give you His peace.
